BE IT ORDAINED, By the City Council of the City of Augusta, as follows:

That Chapter 18, section 73 Schedule of no parking, restricted parking areas, of the Revised Code of Ordinances 1990, as amended be further amended by deleting the following:

Sewall Street:

No parking on either side from Western Avenue south to a point two hundred seventy-two (272) feet south of Western Avenue.

No parking on the west side from Capitol Street northerly for three hundred seventy-five (375) feet.

No parking on the east side from Capitol Street northerly for four hundred eighty-five (485) feet.

Parking shall be limited to one (1) hour on the west side from a point two hundred seventy-two (272) feet south of Western Avenue to a point three hundred seventy-five (375) feet north of Capitol Street.

That Chapter 18, section 73 Schedule of no parking, restricted parking areas, of the Revised Code of Ordinances 1990, as amended be further amended by adding the following:

Sewall Street:

No parking on the west side from Western Avenue south to a point three hundred ten (310) feet south of Western Avenue.

WHEREAS, The City of Augusta has suffered for years the adverse impacts of a federal policy that requires heavy trucks to exit the Maine Turnpike at Western Avenue in Augusta and travel through secondary streets in order to proceed to the north and east, and

WHEREAS, the risks to the public's safety posed by this policy are great and the costs to Augusta in highway maintenance and repair are also great, and

WHEREAS, Senator Susan Collins and Senator Olympia Snowe and Representative Tom Allen and Representative Michael Michaud have worked tirelessly to effect a change in federal policy that will permit heavy truck traffic to bypass downtown Augusta and remain on Interstate 95 to the new Third Bridge exit, effectively resolving the public safety and cost burden problems facing the Capital City, and

WHEREAS, the members of the Maine Congressional Delegation have recently notified the City of Augusta of their success in securing relief in this matter.
