 WHEREAS, the 2007 Comprehensive Plan for the City of Augusta strongly recommends improved site design along Augusta's gateway roads.

WHEREAS, improved site design has proven to occur best through a public hearing process at the Planning Board level.

WHEREAS, the Planning Board is in the process of re-writing the Land Use Ordinance, but does not anticipate having it completed for Council review and public hearing until late winter.

WHEREAS, projects that occur prior to an anticipated final

 approval of a new ordinance could have a significant and long-term impact on the gateways.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Augusta that the Augusta Land Use Ordinance be amended as follows:

Amend Section 2.2 of the Augusta Land Use Ordinance

Development: Development means any change caused by individuals or entities to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to the construction of buildings or other structures; the construction of additions or substantial improvements to buildings or other structures; mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation, drilling operations, or storage of equipment or materials; and the storage, deposition, or extracton of materials, public or private sewage disposal systems or water supply facilities.

(1) Major development:

a. For parcels that have access to or frontage on the following streets or roads, major development includes any new or redeveloped non-residential or multi-family residential project that creates or redevelops any floor space or impervious surface:

- i. Western Avenue - from I-95 to Memorial Circle
- ii. Memorial Circle
- iii. Cony Circle
- iv. Bangor Street
- v. Riverside Drive - from Bangor Street to Rt 3
- vi. State Street
- vii. Mt Vernon Avenue
- viii. Sewall Street - from Western Avenue to the Hallowell municipal boundary
- ix. Capitol Street
- x. Armory Street
- xi. Winthrop Street
- xii. Leighton Road
- xiii. Stone Street
- xiv. Hospital Street - from Stone Street to Piggery Road
- xv. Cony Street - from Kennebec River to South Belfast Avenue
- xvi. Water Street
- xvii. Northern Avenue

xviii. Grove Street - from Memorial Circle to Water Street

b. For all parcels not affected by (a) above, a major development is any new or re-developed non-residential or multi-family residential project that disturbs one (1) acre of land or more, or creates or adds to one (1) acre of impervious surface on a parcel. It shall include any multi-family residential or non-residential change of use that affects or disturbs one (1) acre of land or more. Disturbed land includes but is not limited to new impervious surface or any re-development or modification of existing impervious surface.

(2) Minor development: Requiring a permit from the CEO if listed as a permitted use or requiring a permit from the Planning Board if listed as a conditional use.

(a.) The owner, keeper or any other individual who has responsibility of a dog shall keep such animal controlled by a leash when such animal is on the property of a school or playground and the Rail Trail.

That Chapter 19, section 19-38 Rates, Schedule of Taxicab Rates, of the Revised Code of Ordinances 1990, as amended, be further amended by adding and deleting as follows:

CHAPTER 19 - SECTION 38

No taxicab operator or taxicab driver shall charge a sum for

the use of a taxicab higher than that in accordance with the following rates:

(A) A total of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) for one and one dollar (\$1.00) for each additional person ten (10) years of age and over, and fifty cents (\$0.50) for each child under ten (10) years of age, from the same point of hire to the same destination.

An additional fifty cents (\$0.50) shall be to all fares on Sundays, holidays, and between midnight and 6:00 a.m. daily.

{1} Starting points.

{a} Water Street and Bridge Street lights.

{2} Maximum distance of travel for minimum fare.

{a} Banger Street light.

{b} South Belfast Avenue to Quimby Street.

{c} Stone Street to Eastern Avenue lights including Crocker and Davenport as far as Mitchell Street.

{d} Arsenal Street to State Hospital gate.

{e} Cony Street to Malta Street.

{f} Mt. Vernon Avenue to Mt. Vernon Avenue Playground

{g} Northern Avenue to Monroe Street.

{h} Washington Street to Monroe Street.

{i} State Street to Union Street.

{j} Sewall Street to Capitol Street light.

{k} Winthrop Street to Granite Street.

{l} Green Street to Cushman Street.

{m} Western Avenue to Cushman Street.

{3} (1) Rates of travel shall be two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) for the first one mile or portion thereof, and seventy five cents (\$0.75) one dollar (\$1.00) for each 1/2 mile or portion thereof thereafter.

(B) Use of vehicle trunks/luggage areas may be charged for at the rate of one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50).

(C) Charges for waiting time shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00) an hour. Charges for waiting time shall begin ten minutes after the fare has exited the cab or upon the cabs arrival at the designated time of fare pickup and shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for the first half hour or any portion thereof and twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the

hour or a portion thereof following the first half hour calculated time.

(D) Minimum charge for errands shall be two dollars (\$2.00) over the cost of the fare.

(E) An additional fee of one dollar (\$1.00) shall be charged for aiding with groceries, parcels, etc.

(F) A rate card shall be displayed at all times in each taxicab. A rate card displaying these rates shall be displayed at all times in the taxicab in such a manner as to allow taxicab passenger(s) full view of the taxicab rates.
