To the City Council of Augusta.

The undersigned Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the petition of Joseph S. Whitney and others for a new street, after having given due notice have this day made the following location, to wit:

Beginning in the northerly line of the street leading from Bangor Street to Kennebec Dam at a point where the southwest corner of land of Jeremiah Furbush intersects the same; thence running North 23 degrees East on the rangeway between Lots No. 28 and 29 and also over land of Lewis and Elizabeth Allen to the northerly line of said Allen's land; whole distance about twenty-six rods said street to be westerly of the above line and forty feet wide, no damages claimed.
