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Petition of Sturgis Lambard and Co. for a street to be laid out by their property which was in council referred to a special comm. sent up for con. read and ref. to com. on new streets in nonconcurrence. S.D.F.C. and after a comm. on con. was had the council voted to recede and ref. to comm. on new st. in con.

Com. rep. in favor of ext. Arsenal St. S. to the Arsenal Gate, read and accepted and city clerk directed to issue notices. S.D.F.C. returned read and accepted in concurrence.

ARSENAL STREET

Know All Men by These Presents,

That we, William H. Faulkingham and Edith Faulkingham, both of Farmingdale, in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine

in consideration of one dollar and other valuable considerations

paid by City of Augusta, a body politic and corporate organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maine and having a place of business at Augusta, in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine

the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, a certain lot or parcel of land situated on the east side of the river in Augusta, Maine:

Beginning at a point on the south side of Cony Street where it is intersected by the westerly line of Arsenal Street, so-called; thence southerly along the westerly side of said Arsenal Street 65'; thence northerly about 74.35' to the intersection of the easterly line of Howard Street, so-called, with the southerly line of said Cony Street; thence easterly along the southerly side of said Cony Street 29' to the point of beginning. Meaning and intending to convey a triangular parcel of land off from the northerly end of a lot of land deeded to us by Agnes Faulkingham February 15, 1957 as recorded in Book 1122, Page 103 at the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds, to be used for the widening of the intersection of Arsenal and Cony Street.
