Description of that section requested to be discontinued:

473 ORDERED, That portion of a public way known as the Ballard Road lying easterly of Civic Center Drive and westerly of the following described line:

Beginning at an iron pin set on the northerly boundary of land now or formerly of Edward J. Bonenfant, (Kennebec County Registry of Deeds, Book 620, Page 154), which point is also the southeast corner of land now or formerly of Frank X. Pomerleau (Book 3263, Page 173); thence North 13 degrees 58 minutes East 246.6 feet to an iron pin; thence North 32 degrees 29 minutes East 300.2 feet to an iron pin; thence North 32 degrees 30 minutes East 261.8 feet to an iron pin; thence South 89 degrees 25 minutes West 160.3 feet to an iron pin; thence North 84 degrees 12 minutes West along the southerly boundary of land now or formerly of David and Laurie Murray (Kennebec County Registry of Deeds, Book 2984, Page 63) a distance of 209.4 feet; thence North 8 degrees 15 minutes East along said land of Murray a

distance of 144.8 feet to an iron pin at the northwesterly corner of said Murray land and the northeasterly corner of land formerly of Steven and Debra Nedik; thence North 8 degrees 15 minutes East crossing the present location of the Ballard Road; so-called, to a point to be marked with an iron pin set on the southerly boundary of land now or formerly of Evelina and David Gauthier (Kennebec County Registry of Deeds, Book 3248, Page 149); thence North 77 degrees 12 minutes West along said Gauthier land a distance of 195 feet, more or less, to an iron pin at land now of Frank X. Pomerleau described in a deed recorded in Book 3266, Page 26; thence North 14 degrees 01 minutes East 800 feet, more or less, along said land now or formerly of Frank X. Pomerleau to an iron pin.
