Griffith; thence running westerly about two hundred (200) feet was Read and Accepted and a Hearing Ordered before the Committee on Highways and Sewers.

READ AND ACCEPTED

In Board of Aldermen
To the Honorable Mayor and City Council:

We, the undersigned citizens and taxpayers of the City of Augusta respectfully petition that a street be laid out, to wit:

Beginning at a point in the west line of Bangor Street, at the northeast corner of land of Herbert C. Griffith; thence westerly along a passage way leading to the Williams Cemetery, as delineated on a plan by W. B. Getchell C. E., of the Cony Field, 1899-1902, a distance of about two hundred (200) feet or to Bowdoin Street on said plan, said street to be known as Bangor Street Place.

Upon the foregoing petition it is ordered that written notices thereof be posted according to law and that a hearing thereon be given by the Joint Standing Committee on Highways and Sewers at the Aldermen’s Room, September 16, 1912 at 7:30 p.m. at which time and place all persons interested and appearing may be heard.

The foregoing Petition and Order of Notice thereon were Read, the Petition Accepted, the Order of Notice Passed, both being Sent Down for Concurrence. Returned by the Common Council

Endorsed for Concurrent Action. Pursuant to the action of the City Council the following notice was given:

Whereas application has been made to the City Council of the City of Augusta to layout a new street to be known as Bangor Street Place. Beginning at a point in the west line of Bangor Street, at the northeast corner of land owned or occupied by Herbert C. Griffith; thence westerly along a passageway leading to the Williams Cemetery, as delineated on a plan by W. B. Getchell, C. E., of the Cony Field 1899-1902, a distance of about two hundred (200) feet or to Bowdoin Street on said plan; And whereas said City Council has directed an order of notice upon said application; All persons interested are therefore notified of the intention of the City Council to layout said street and are hereby further notified to appear before the Joint Committee of the City Council on Highways and Sewers at the Aldermen’s Room, City Building, in said Augusta, on September 16th, A.D. 1912, at 7:30 o’clock in the afternoon, at which time and place a hearing relative to the proposed laying out of said street will be had. Dated at said Augusta this 30th day of August A.D. 1912.

The following Report of the Committee on Highways and Sewers was Accepted, and the accompanying Order was Read and Passed, both being Sent Down for Concurrence and Returned by the Common Council Endorsed for Concurrent Action:

The Joint Standing Committee on Highways and Sewers to whom was referred the matter of laying out of Bangor Street Place having considered the matter therein, beg leave to report that, as laid out by plan and surveyor’s description the acceptance of said street is a public necessity. Your Committee recommends the passage of the accompanying order.

Committee of Highways and Sewers

ORDERED, That Bangor Street Place, as laid out by plan and surveyor's description attached, be and hereby is accepted by the City, no land damage being assessed or allowed.

Bounds and Admeasurements of Bangor Street Place

Surveyor's Description

Commencing at a stone monument in the west line of Bangor Street at the north east corner of land now owned by Herbert C. Griffith from thence; running westerly along the north line of said H. C. Griffith's land (being Lot #7) and along the north line of Lot #8, a distance of 200 feet to a stone monument in the intersection of the east line of a street known as Bowdoin Street and to continue the same course westerly 40 feet more or less to a point where the west line of Bowdoin Street intersects the above described line; thence northerly in range with the westerly line of said Bowdoin Street to a point in the south line of land now or formerly owned by George S. Williams which shall be 39 feet from the first described line measurements at right angles to same; thence easterly parallel with the first described course to a point in the westerly line of Bangor Street; thence southerly along the westerly line of Bangor Street to the stone monument at a point of beginning.

Meaning and hereby intending to describe a strip of land 39 feet wide to extend from the westerly line of Bangor Street to a line which is a continuation of the westerly line of Bowdoin Street; the same being shown on a plan made by W. B. Getchell of "Cony Field", 1899-1902.

READ AND PASSED

A-334 ORDERED, That a portion of Bangor Street Place, so-called, be accepted as a City Street as follows:

A certain lot or parcel of land situated on the easterly side of the river in Augusta, Maine. Beginning at a point on the northerly line of said Bangor Street Place, said point being two hundred

forty feet (240') west of the westerly line of Bangor Street; thence westerly a distance of two hundred feet (200'), and extension of the northerly line of said Bangor Street Place as accepted August 19, 1912; thence at about a right angle in a southerly direction a distance of forty-three feet (43'); thence at about a right angle easterly a distance of two hundred feet (200') to the westerly line of Bowdoin Street; thence at about a right angle northerly a distance of thirty-nine feet (39') to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to accept a portion of Bangor Street Place as a City street thirty-nine feet more or less (39') wide and two hundred feet (200') long as shown on "Plan of Bangor Street Place" made by the City of Augusta Highway Department and dated October 25, 1950.
