WHEREAS, application is made to the City Council of the City of Augusta to layout, establish and accept as a new street and public way, Bennett Lane, so-called, running northerly from Eastern Avenue to Cedar Street as indicated by a plan dated December 29, 1932 by W. W. Hill and filed at the office of the City Clerk.

WHEREAS, the City Council has ordered that notice be given upon which such application; All persons interested are therefore notified of the intention of the City Council to layout and establish said street and are further notified to appear before the Joint Committee of the City Council on Highways and Sewers, being the Committee of the City Council having the matter in charge, at the Aldermen's Room, City Hall, in said Augusta on February 20, 1933 at 7:30 o'clock in the evening at which time and place a hearing relative to the proposed laying out and establishing of said street will be had.

READ AND PASSED

A-145 ORDERED, That Bennett Lane running perpendicular to and between Cedar Street and Eastern Avenue be discontinued as a City street.

The above order was referred to the Committee on Highways and I placed an advertisement in the Kennebec Journal December 7, 1943 advertising a hearing on proposal to be held in Municipal Chambers, City Hall, Monday, December 20, 1943 at 7:30 p.m. E.W.T.

At the hearing Mrs. Hewins and Mrs. Gaslin appeared in opposition the City Council voted to Table Order and request City Solicitor to draw up papers binding on the residents of Bennett Lane to waive all rights to future claims against the City by virtue of Bennett Lane continuing as an accepted street.

At the regular meeting of City Government January 17, 1944, the Committee on Highways asked for and received one month's extension.

At the meeting of City Government February 28, 1944, the Committee on Highways reported that after several discussions with Mr. Gaslin it had failed to secure his signature to the waiver of rights paper drawn up by the City Solicitor and therefore recommended Order to discontinue Bennett Lane as an accepted street. OUGHT TO PASS.

ORDER A-145 as originally drawn was then passed in concurrence.
This is a true record.
