VOTED

VOTED, At the Annual Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta, qualified to vote in Town affairs duly and legally notified and held at the Town House in said Augusta on Monday this Eighth day of March A.D. 1841.

ARTICLE 6, To the Selectmen of Augusta. The undersigned inhabitants of said town hereby request you to layout a road, as follows:

Commencing at the westerly line of Benjamin P. Blair's land, on the second mile east of Kennebec River; thence running westerly on the line between Dana and Smith or as near the same as the land will admit, until it strikes the travelled bed road leading from the top of Malta Hill to R. F. Hall's; and lay the same before the Town at their next meeting for acceptance.

and Seven others

February 23, 1841, The undersigned have this day layed out a road on the within petition as follows:

Commencing in the west line of Benjamin P. Blair's land at a point one rod north of his south line; thence running North 65 2/3 degrees West and parallel with the side lines of lots about

ninety-eight rods to a stake; thence seven rods to the road as now travelled leading to R. F. Hall's, said road to be two rods wide and south of said line, all persons interested were notified and no damages were claimed by any persons.

**SENT DOWN FOR CONCURRENCE**

Alderman Doe from the Committee on New Streets to which was referred the petition of J.W. Patterson praying for an alteration in the road leading from Church's hill to the River road, reported as follows, viz:

"That in conformity with a notice posted upon the 28<sup>th</sup> day of November 1850 in the public places in the City in the vicinity of said road of the intention of the City Council to make a new location of said road on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of December at 3 o'clock P.M. at the North Parish Meetinghouse in said City. Your Committee assembled at the time and place mentioned in said notice and proceeded to the location of Street and laid out the same as follows, viz:

Beginning on the east side of the County river road and on the north side of the road leading easterly by the North Parish Meetinghouse at a stake thence South 65 degrees East ninety rods to a stake & stones; thence North 83 degrees 30 minutes East forty rods to a stake and stone on the west bank up the Brook about two rods north of the Bridge. Road to be four rods wide and South and east of courses and bounds.

VOTED

To the City Council of Augusta

The undersigned hereby represent that the road leading from the river road by the North Parish Meetinghouse to Church Hill, so-called, as now travelled in from a point 7 ½ rods easterly from the east line of the river road, nearby to the mill brook, out of its true location, as located by the Town November 3, 1800, and as appears by the report of the Committee appointed by the Selectmen to ascertain the boundaries of the roads and streets in Town, in 1847, which report was accepted by the Town in the Spring of 1848, and your petitioners would further represent that in their opinion the interest of the City would be best promoted, by locating said road anew, as now travelled, and discontinuing so much of the old location as shall not be needed; they therefore request that you will cause the same to be examined and such action had thereon as shall be considered best.

City of Augusta January 15, 1851

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of J. W. Patterson and others for an alteration in the Church Hill Road, have had that matter under consideration and would report. That in conformity with a notice posted up on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of November 1850, in two public places in the City in the vicinity of said road, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of December at 3 o'clock in the afternoon at the North Parish Meetinghouse in said City, your Committee assembled at the time and place mentioned in said notice and proceeded to the location of said street, and laid out the same as follows, viz: Beginning on the east side of the County river road and on the north side of the road leading easterly by the North Parish Meetinghouse at a stake; thence South 65 degrees East ninety rods to a stake and stones; thence North 83 degrees 30' East forty rods to a stake and stone; thence South 86 degrees East nineteen rods to a stake and stone on the west bank of the brook about two rods North of the bridge.

Road to be four rods wide and south and east of the courses and bounded.
