Upon the foregoing petition it is ordered that written notices thereof be posted according to law and that a hearing thereon be given by the Joint Standing Committee on Highways and Sewers at the Aldermen's Room, November 18, 1912 at 7:30 p.m. at which time and place all persons interested and appearing may be heard.

The foregoing Petition and Order of Notice thereon were Read, the Petition Accepted, the Order of Notice Passed, both being Sent Down for Concurrence. Returned by the Common Council Endorsed for Concurrent Action.

Pursuant to the action of the City Council the following notice was given:

Whereas application has been made to the City Council of the City of Augusta to layout a new street to be known as Bowdoin Street beginning at a point in the east line of Linden Street; thence easterly to Bangor Street Place, a distance of about three hundred and seventy-five (375) feet, as delineated on a plan of W. B. Getchell C. E., of the Cony Field of 1899-1902; And whereas said City Council has directed an Order of Notice upon said application; All persons interested are therefore notified of the intention of the City Council to layout said street and are hereby further Notified to appear before the Joint Committee of the City Council on Highways and Sewers at the Aldermen's Room, City Building, in said Augusta, on November 18th, A.D. 1912, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, at which time and place a hearing relative to the proposed laying out of said street will be had.

ORDERED, That Bowdoin Street, as laid out by plan and surveyor's description attached, be and hereby is accepted by the City, no land damage being assessed or allowed.

Bounds and Admeasurements of Bowdoin Street

Surveyor's Description

Commencing at a stone monument in the north line of Linden Street said monument being 200 feet westerly from the west line of Bangor Street measures on the north line of Linden Street and from; thence running on a line which marks the westerly line of Lots, 15, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 8 on a plan of the "Cony Field" as surveyed by W. B. Getchell, 1899 to a stone monument in the south line of Bangor Street Place, which monument is 200 feet westerly of the west line of Bangor Street measured on the south line of said Bangor Street Place; thence westerly along the south line of Bangor Street Place so far as to make the street herein described 40 feet wide measured at right angles to the east line of Bowdoin Street herein described; thence southerly and parallel with the easterly line of the street herein described and keeping 40 feet therefrom to a point in the north line of Linden Street said Bowdoin Street

being about 382 6/10 feet on the east line and about 374 5/10 feet on the west line; thence easterly along the northerly line of Linden Street to monument at point of beginning. Meaning and hereby intending to describe a parcel of land 40 feet wide to extend from the north line of Linden Street to the south line of Bangor Street Place to be known as Bowdoin Street.
