At a legal annual meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote in Town affairs holden at the Town House in said Augusta, March 13th and by adjournment April 3, 1837.

ARTICLE 8th: VOTED To accept an alteration in a street on the west side of Kennebec River as the same is laid out by the Selectmen reported and described by them as follows to wit:

Augusta, June 14, 1836

The Selectmen of Augusta have this day widened Bridge Street, opposite Elisha Halletts house as follows:

Beginning on State Street twenty-three feet south of the south line of Bridge Street; thence extending westerly to a point on the street leading by Judge Weston's house, thirteen feet south of the south line of Bridge Street, thereby widening said Bridge Street twenty-three feet on State street and thirteen feet at the west end of the High School House lot before widening said street, and we agreed to give the proprietors of said High School House lot for damages for land taken into said Bridge Street the sum of one hundred and fifty-five dollars and seven cents.

Bounded on the north by Bennett Street, on the east by land supposed to be owned by John H. May, on the south by Bridge Street, and on the west by land supposed to be owned by John P. Wyman and land of John Parsons and 104 others.

The foregoing Petition was Read and Referred to Committee on New Streets and Order of Notice directed thereon. Sent Down for Concurrence. It subsequently came back from the Common Council. Read and Referred and Order of Notice Directed in Concurrence.

That the Committee met at the appointed time and place and heard all persons interested and appearing, and were unanimously of opinion that there is no necessity for the laying out and acceptance of said street, and respectfully recommend that the petitioners be given leave to withdraw.

Commencing 6 1/2 feet Northeasterly from James Bridge's brick store opposite the Kennebec Bridge at a stone monument marked R; thence N. 67 1/2 W. 60 feet which distance the road is to be forty feet wide thence southerly at right angles 5 feet to a stone marked R., 2 feet west of the Northwest corner of said Bridge's store; thence N. 63 1/2 W. 26 rods to a stone marked R; thence N. 64 1/2 W. 14 rods to a stone marked R a little west of Saffords Spring; thence N. 80 W. 3 rods to a stone marked R. at Saffords corner; said three rods to be fifty feet wide at its commencement and sixty feet at its termination the variation of which 3 rods from a direct line from the last angle to be made entirely on the south side, which the North line thereof is to be a direct continuation of the angle N. 64 1/2 West to a stone marked R. near Eben Fullers South line. ARTICLE 2, To see if the Town will accept of two roads laid out
by the Selectmen, agreeable to the plan and minutes of Henry
Fuller, esquire.

I have notified the inhabitants of the Town of Augusta, to meet
at the time and place and for the purposes above mentioned by
posting up true and attested copies of the above warrant, at the
Meetinghouse at the Schoolhouse near Jeremiah Babcock's and at
the dwelling house of Luther Ingraham, all in said Augusta
fourteen days at least previous to the day of meeting
above-mentioned.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Augusta,
qualified to vote in Town affairs, on Monday the third day of
April, A.D. 1820.

ARTICLE 2, VOTED, That the following described roads, near Colo.
H. W. Fuller's be accepted and established, viz: One
beginning in the northerly line of the county road leading to
Winthrop at the distance of ten rods and nine feet from the
westerly line of the road leading by the jail and meetinghouse,
and running northerly parallel with the said road leading by the
jail and meetinghouse, about forty-eight rods; this line to be
his easterly side of the road to be forty feet in width. The
other is southerly line to commence in the westerly line of the
road leading by the jail and meetinghouse, at the distance of
fifty-two feet northerly from the northeast corner land owned by
Greenwood C. Child; thence running North eighty degrees West
about ten rods and nine feet, to the east line of the road first
above described; thence North eighty-nine degrees West about
forty feet to the westerly line of the road first above


