ARTICLE 24 VOTED, To accept a road on the east side of Kennebec River agreeably to the report of the Selectmen of the laying out of the same, which report is as follows, viz:

Commencing in the east line of Arsenal Street at a stone monument near the corner of William A. Brooks fence and running South 67 degrees East about 38 ½ rods to Middle Street. All parties were notified by posting up two warrants seven days before the location and no damages were claimed except by William A. Brooks. Said road to be two rods wide and lying south of said monuments. A plan of said road is on file.

VOTED

At the Annual Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta held by adjournment at the Town House in said Augusta on Monday the 24<sup>th</sup> day of March AD 1845, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

ARTICLE 24, To the Selectmen of the Town of Augusta.

The undersigned inhabitants of the Town of Augusta, respectfully represent that a town way commencing at a point on Arsenal Street where it is intersected by a fence on the south side of William A. Brooks' dwelling house; thence running easterly such a course to Middle Street as will make the north line of said contemplated street a continuation of the same as now fenced out by the said Brooks, in said Augusta is much wanted for the use of the inhabitants thereof, and that such a town way would be of public convenience and utility. They would therefore pray that you would cause to be laid out and opened a town way as above described for the use and convenience of said Inhabitants, all which is respectfully submitted and prayed for as aforesaid.

**ARTICLE 18**

At the annual meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote in Town affairs, legally called and notified, held at the Town House in said Augusta on Monday the sixth day of March, A.D. 1848, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, and also be adjournment on the tenth day of April 1848.

To the Selectmen of Augusta,

Gentlemen:

The undersigned inhabitants of said Town hereby request you to layout a road commencing at Middle Street east of Kennebec River and terminating at Hospital Street, being a continuation of Cedar Street, and lay your proceedings before the Town at their next annual meeting for acceptance.

February 16, 1848

The undersigned have this day laid out on the above petition the following road, to wit: Beginning at a point on the easterly side of Middle Street; thence running South 65 degrees East 34 rods to the County road leading to the Insane Hospital, the above described line to be the north line of the same and to be three rods wide, no damages claimed. The above to be a continuation of Cedar Street.

No damages appraised.
