PETITION, To his Honor the Mayor and Gentlemen of the City Council:~

The subscribers respectfully represents that it would be difficult to construct a side walk on that portion of Chapel Street between Weston and Green Streets in consequence of some large trees standing between the fence and street in the line of the walk. He therefore prays the City Council to widen Chapel Street two feet on the westerly side thereof between Weston and Green Streets, which would permit a walk to be built on the westerly side of the trees, no damage would be claimed by the abutters beyond the cost of removing the fence, except one, who agrees to sell the same to the City for the sum of fifteen dollars.~

Whereas the City Council of the City of Augusta havebeen petitioned by J. G. Phinney to widen Chapel Street two feet on the westerly side between Weston and Green Streets, that a side walk

may be built on the westerly side of trees standing on said street and the said Council at a session thereof on the thirtieth day of September 1865.~

ORDERED, The City Clerk to give notice of the intention of said Council to widen said street or road. All persons interested are hereby notified to appear before a Committee of said Council on the premises at 1 o'clock p.m. on the fourteenth day of October 1865. When and where said Committee will proceed to layout the same.~

The Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the petition of John G. Phinney to have Chapel Street widened two feet between Weston and Green Streets and upon which notice was ordered, have had the same under consideration and report. That the City Clerk gave notice to layout or widen said street as prayed for on the west side from Weston Street to, and terminating at Green Street which notices were posted one on the fence corners of Chapel and Court Streets, and one on a tree, corner of Weston and Chapel Streets on the 7th day of October 1865, notifying all persons interested to appear before a Committee of said Council at one o'clock p.m. on the 14th day of October 1865, on the premises, at which time and place your Committee met and after viewing the route, hearing the petitioners and considering the matter laid out and widened Chapel Street as follows, viz: Commencing in the north line of Green Street two feet west of the southeast corner of William Stratton's land; and from thence running northerly parallel with the west line of Chapel Street and distant therefrom westerly two feet to the south line of Weston Street thereby widening Chapel Street on the westerly side by taking two feet from the front of the lots of William M. Stratton, Allen Lombard, Edward G. Doe, and Margaret Cothbert. The three first owners claim no damage provided the City removes their fences to the line, and Mrs. Cothbert has proposed to release to the City for the sum of \$15.00 and have her fence removed on to the new line by the City. On the 14th day of October 1865 your Committee filed with the City Clerk of said City the laying out of said street with the bounds and admeasurements of said street, as above reported and we have estimated the damages of laying out of said street as follows , viz: none except as above stated.

ORDERED, That the Street Commissioner for the Western District be, and he hereby is authorized and directed, under the direction of the Mayor, and the Joint Standing Committee on Highways and Sewers, to widen the junction of Grove and Chapel Streets, as contemplated by a plan prepared by the City Engineer.

The order subsequently came back read and referred to the Committee on Highways, in non-concurrence. On motion of Alderman Hichborn, the Board receded and concurred with the Common Council in such reference.
