To James Black one of the Constables of the Town of Augusta, within said County. In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to warn the freeholders and other inhabitants of the said Town of Augusta, qualified to vote in Town affairs, to meet and assemble at the Town House on Monday the twenty-fifth day of March instant, at ten of the clock in the forenoon then and there to act on the following articles, viz:

ARTICLE 7, To determine if the Town will accept of such roads as have been laid out by the Selectmen.

VOTED

At the annual meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Augusta, qualified to vote in Town affairs, legally called and notified, held at the Town House on Monday March 25, 1833, at 10 o'clock a.m. and by adjournment on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of April then next at 9 a.m.

ARTICLE 7 VOTED, To accept a street laid out by the selectmen on the west side of Kennebec River reported and described by them as follows, to wit:

Commencing on the east side of the County Road nearly opposite the dwelling house of Greenwood C. Childs, and fifteen feet north of the south line of the lot belonging to the South Parish in Augusta; thence running easterly keeping the distance of fifteen feet from said south line to the east line of said Parish Lot.

Said street to be on the south of said line, and to be thirty feet wide, one half of said street, being laid on the south side of said Parish Lot, and one half on the north side of lots belonging to James Bridge, Jr. and Horatio Bridge. The officers of the South Parish and the said James Bridge, Jr. and Horatio Bridge were duly and seasonably notified, no damages were agreed to be paid, and none claimed by any of the parties interested.
