To the City Council of Augusta.

The undersigned respectfully represent that a street leading from Bangor Road near the Whitney Tavern, westerly to the Kennebec River is much needed, and therefore respectfully, petition your honors to layout the same at your earliest convenience.

June 2, 1853

Ezekiel Ware and 13 others

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of Ezekiel Ware and others for a new street having attended to that duty report that they proceeded to layout a street beginning at a hemlock post in the west line of Bangor Street; thence running North 60 degrees West to the northwest corner of the late John Clark's house, distance eleven rods and eleven feet; thence North 65 degrees West twelve rods to a hub in the ground fourteen feet northerly from the northwest corner of Ezekiel Ware's house; thence North 77 degrees West nine rods and six and a half feet to a hub in the gravel bank; thence North 61 degrees West about thirty-one and a half rods to Kennebec River, said street to be northerly of said line and thirty feet wide. The Committee allow no damages.
