VOTED

At a legal annual meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote in Town affairs holden at the Town House in said Augusta on Monday the eleventh day of April A.D.~ 1836.~

ARTICLE 11 VOTED, To accept the report of the Selectmen so far as it relates to the laying out of the road near the dwelling house of Samuel T. E. Nason mentioned in this article which report is as follows viz:~

The undersigned Selectmen have laid out a road and a street in pursuance to previous application therefor according to the minutes of S. E. Remick, Surveyor, all persons interested were seasonably notified and no damages were claimed except by Christopher Ripley, and we were unable to agree with him as to the amount.

The road near Samuel R. Nason's house was laid out by us on the 14th day of August 1835 and the street by Christopher Ripley's on the 2nd day of July 1835.

The following are the minutes of the Surveyor of the location of the Road near Samuel R. Nason's house referred to in the foregoing report of the Selectmen, viz:~

Record of a road in Augusta on the east side of the Kennebec River. Beginning at a stake and stone on the new Thomaston Road; thence running North 25 degrees East 82 rods to Samuel R. Nason north line. The road to be three rods wide and made on the west of this line which strikes at the well easterly of Samuel R. Nason's house.

Surveyed August 14, 1835 by S. E. Remick.

VOTED, That the old road leading from near the house of Samuel R. Nason, to near the house of Henry Chadwick be discontinued.

VOTED

At a special meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote in Town affairs legally notified and held May 14th 1838.~

ARTICLE 9, To the Selectmen of Augusta~

Gentlemen~

The undersigned represents that the road commencing at the Thomaston Road, and running northerly to the north line of his land, as accepted by the Town April 11, 1836 is not in such place as would best suit his convenience, he therefore requests that you would make an alteration in said road for his benefit and lay it before the Town at their next meeting for their acceptance.~

Augusta April 30, 1838

Robert F. Hall~

The undersigned on the first day of May 1838 laid out a road on the within petition commencing on the north line of land of Robert F. Hall at a stone wall; thence running southerly on said stone wall and containing the same direction of said wall to the Thomaston Road and terminating at a stake and stones, said road to be three rods wide and to be west of said line. Said road is about one and a-half rods at the north end and about six rods at the south end further east than the road which was accepted by the Town April 11, 1836.

At the Annual Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta legally qualified to vote in town affairs, duly notified according to law, and holden at the Town House in said Augusta on Monday the fourth day of March 1844, at 10 o'clock a.m. and also by adjournment on Monday the first day of April 1844, at 10 o'clock a.m.

Augusta November 10, 1843

ARTICLE 13 VOTED, We the undersigned Selectmen of Augusta have this day located the following road, viz:~

Commencing in the south line of the Blair Road at a stake and stone; and thence running South 22 degrees West, distance 33 rods to a stake in the east line of the road in front of T. Robinson's house formerly R. F. Hall's. Said road is to be 3 rods wide laying westerly of said bound. Notice being given according to law - no damages claimed - the above being a substitute for the one now passing by Dana's barn.~
