To the City Council of the City of Augusta,

The undersigned inhabitants of said Augusta respectfully represent that a portion of the Coombs Road lying between a point two rods north of Esther Bodwell's south line and the Belgrade Road at Brackett's Corner is not required for the public convenience and therefore that the same may be discontinued.

The Committee to whom was referred the Petition of George Leighton and others for the discontinuance of a portion of the Coombs Road, so-called, have had that subject under consideration and ask leave to report.

That the prayer of your petitioners be granted, and that the said road be discontinued.
