READ AND ACCEPTED

To James Black one of the Constables of the Town of Augusta, SS

Greeting

You are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn the male inhabitants of said Town being twenty-one years of age and resident in said Town for the space of one year next preceding having a freehold estate within said Town of the annual income of ten dollars, or any estate to the value of two hundred dollars, to meet at the Meeting House in said Augusta on Monday the second day of May next at two of the clock in the afternoon for the purpose of choosing a Representative to represent them at the General Court appointed to be convened and held at Boston on the last Wednesday of May next— You are also further required to notify and warn the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of said Town qualified to vote in Town affairs to meet at the same place on the same second day of May at three of the clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles viz:

ARTICLE 5, To see if the Town will accept of a road leading from Nathan Weston’s store north of the Courthouse into the Court House Street agreeable to the minutes as laid out by the selectmen, the above road is thirty feet wide.

ARTICLE 6 VOTED, To accept the road laid out by the Selectmen the minutes of which are as follows, viz:

Beginning at the easterly side of the County Road leading from the Meeting House toward Hallowell and sixteen feet northerly from the northeasterly corner of Captain Nathan Weston’s store adjoining said County Road at a stake; thence North sixty-four degrees West four rods; thence North seventy degrees West nine rods; thence North sixty West twelve rods; thence North sixty-seven and half west twenty-two rods and about seventeen links to the easterly side of the County Road leading from the goal (jail) by the Court House towards Hallowell, the road is northerly of the courses above mentioned, and thirty feet wide.

Com. at a stone post on the W. side of Front St.near the Blacksmith shop of Elias Craige 2nd. th. run. N. 64 W. thru N. end of sd. Craig's shop 4 R. thence N. 70 W. 9 R. to a stone set in the ground 4' N. of cedar post in the fence which is the dividing line between Inc. Means and Nath. Weston land thence N. 64 W. 25 3/4 R. to a stone 2' N. from Kendal Nichols ho. th. N. 67 1/2 W. abt. 9 R. to Court St. at a distance of 38' from the S.W. corner of the Court House.

Said St. being on N. side of sd. courses and to be 45' wide on Front St.and 38' at the termination.

Mar. 24, 1828 Cont. to Chapel Street

Beg in W. side of St. lead. by Court ho. at N.E. cor. of a lot of land bel. to Ruel Williams and Nathan Weston Jr. on which the tav. ho. opposite the Court ho. stands; th. run. W.N.W. par'l to road lead. to Winthrop abt. 26 R. to E. side of a rd. laid out par'l with the St. lead by the Co. Ho. road to be 40' wide and N. of the above . line.

From Jr. of Selectmen
Book 1833, Page 18

The undersigned Inhabitants of Augusta respectfully request the Selectmen of Augusta to lay out a street forty-nine and a half feet wide; Commencing on Chapple Street so called, and running westwardly to Sewall Street so called the south line of the Street to run upon the south line of land owned by Curtis of Boston and Redington of Augusta the whole street to run upon their land.

The undersigned have laid out the street petitioned for within, but were not able to notify Mr. Curtis of Boston as he has no agent in this Town.

It is our opinion that the street should be accepted if the town could be indemnified from any damages.

539 ORDERED, That Court Avenue and a portion of Court Street, description below be discontinued.

Beginning at a point 265 feet, more or less, easterly from the intersection of the easterly line of Perham Street and northerly line of Court Street; continuing thence easterly 90 feet, more or less, to the westerly line of the Maine Central Railroad; running thence southerly 35 feet, more or less; running thence westerly 90 feet, more or less; running thence northerly 35 feet, more or less, to the point or place of beginning.

The petitioners hereby agree to hold the City of Augusta harmless of all damages for the closing of said street
