ORDERED, That Court Street Place, as laid out by plan and surveyor’s description attached, be and hereby is accepted by the (city, no land damage being assessed or allowed. (For Surveyor’s description of said streets see Book, Laying Out and Alteration of Streets.) Report accepted and Order passed and sent down for concurrence. Return by Common Council endorsed for concurrent action.

ORDERED, That written notices thereof be posted according to law and that a hearing thereon be given by the Joint Standing Committee on Highways and Sewers at the Aldermen's Room August 26, 1910 at 7:30 p.m. at which time and place all persons interested and appearing may be heard.

The foregoing Petition and Order of Notice thereon were Read, the Petition Accepted and the Order of Notice Passed, both being Sent Down for Concurrence. Returned by The Common Council Endorsed for Concurrent Action.

Pursuant to the action of the City Council the following notice was given:

Whereas application has been made to the City Council of the City of Augusta to layout a new street in Court Street Place, so-called, as now located and used:

Beginning at a point where the west line of land of Allen Partridge intersects said Court Street Place and extending southerly to the north line of land owned by Mrs. A. B. Smith;

And whereas said City Council has directed an order of notice upon said application.

All persons interested are therefore notified of the intention of the City Council to layout said street, and are hereby further notified to appear before the Joint Committee of the City Council in Highways and Sewers, the Committee of the City Council having the matter in charge at the Aldermen's Room City Building, in said Augusta, on August 26th A.D. 1910 at

7:30 o'clock p.m., at which time and place a hearing relative to the proposed laying out of said street will be had.

The following Report of the Committee on Highways and Sewers was Accepted, and the accompanying Order was Read and Passed, both being Sent Down for Concurrence and returned by the Common Council endorsed for Concurrent Action.

The Joint Standing Committee on Highways and Sewers to whom was referred the matter of laying out a new street in Court Street Place, so-called, having considered the matter therein, beg leave to report that the acceptance of said Court Street Place, as laid out by plan and surveyor's description attached, becomes a public necessity.

The Committee recommends, the passage of the accompanying order.

ORDERED, That Court Street Place, as laid out by plan and surveyor's description attached, be and hereby is accepted by the City, no land damage being answered or allowed. Bounds and Admeasurements of Court Street Place

Surveyor's Description

Commencing at a wooden post where the east line of Court Street Place (as now used) intersects the south line of Court Street, said point being 70 feet from a stone monument at the northeast corner of land of Allen Partridge; thence running in a course of South 32 degrees West a distance of 209.5 feet, passing 2.92 feet westerly of the corner of said Allen Partridge's house and 12.75 feet westerly of the northwest corner of the main house owned by Harold Partridge, which line continued would strike the house owned by Mrs. A. B. Smith 45 feet easterly of the northwest corner of said house; thence westerly parallel with the south line of Court Street a distance of 27.25 feet to a point where the easterly line of land of Charles F. Bilodeau intersects land of Mrs. A. B. Smith and the west line of Court Street Place (as now used); thence by a course of North 32 degrees East, passing along the east line of land owned by George H. French and Willis R. Partridge a distance of 209.5 feet to an iron bolt in the south line of Court Street; thence easterly in the south line of Court Street a distance of 27.25 feet to the post at point of beginning; reference being hereby made to a plan of said street made by E. E. Greenwood and Company, Civil Engineers, on file at the office of the City Clerk, which is hereby made a part of this description.
