Watson and said point also being the southwest corner of Sarah Pike; thence easterly at an interior angle of 82 degrees 51 minutes along the southerly line of Sarah Pike and Philibert A. Grondin a distance of one hundred-twenty eight feet (128'); thence northerly at an angle of 97 degrees 09 minutes along the easterly line of said Grondin and Ida I. Watson a distance of one hundred sixty-three feet (163'); thence easterly at an angle of 97 degrees 09 minutes along the southerly line of the "Perry Lot" now owned by Ida I.
