READ AND PASSED

M-76 ORDERED, That Cushing Street, so-called, and not accepted as a City Street, be vacated in part, as described on attached petition.

The subscribers, the Municipal Officers of the City of Augusta, on the petition of William R. O'Connor of said Augusta, to vacate in part the proposed location of Cushing Street, so-called, in said Augusta, which said street is forty feet wide and extends northerly from the Thomaston Road a distance of 613.55 feet to land now or formerly of William Viles and is bounded on the south by the Thomaston Road on the east by land of Perley Cooper, by Lot No. 24 and Lot No. 1, as depicted on, "Plan of Lots on Property of William R. O'Connor on Fairview Avenue, Penley Street and Thomaston Road, Augusta, Kennebec County, Maine," by Henry F. Hill, Civil Engineer, which said plan is recorded in Kennebec Registry of Deeds, Plan Book 7, Page 62; having given seven days' notice of our intentions to vacate in part the proposed location of same, and stated in said notice the termini thereof together with an exact description of that part of the proposed location sort to be vacated, by posting said notices in three public places in said City, and in the vicinity of proposed location of said road, to wit, on Fairview Avenue, on Cushing Street and in City Hall, on the Twelfth day of December, 1949, and having met at a time and a place appointed for that purpose, are of the opinion that there is occasion for vacating in part the proposed location of said street as set out on said plan as proposed.

We, therefore, vacate that portion of the proposed location of said way or road described as follows:

Commencing at the southeasterly corner of Lot 1 on "Plan of Survey of Fairview Addition, "made by Henry F. Hill and recorded in the Kennebec Registry of Deeds, Plan Book 7 Page 62; thence continuing in an easterly direction in the northerly line of Fairview Avenue extended a distance of forty (40) feet more or less to land of William R. O'Connor; thence at about right angles and continuing in a northerly direction along the easterly line of land of the said William R. O'Connor 107.5 feet, more or less to land of Viles; thence at about right angles and continuing in a westerly direction along the southerly line of land of said Viles a distance of forty (40) feet more or less to the northeasterly corner of Lot No. 1 on said plan; thence at about right angles continuing in a southerly direction a distance of 107.5 feet to the point of beginning;

Meaning and intending hereby to describe that portion of Cushing Street conveyed to William R. O'Connor by quit-claim deed of Gertrude N. Flynt, Theresa N. Wadleigh, Brooks and John Newbert.

And we assess damage occasioned thereby as follows, to wit: Nothing.

Such petition for vacating in part the said location of Street with the boundaries and measurements, was filed with the City Clerk, on the twelfth day of December, 1949, being at least seven days before this meeting; and we now hereby report a vacating of the portion of the proposed location of said way and street with the boundaries and measurements of the same.

The action on the within report of the said Municipal Officers of the City of Augusta shall be filed forthwith in the office of the City Clerk and made a part of the record as provided by Section 45, Chapter 84 of the 1944 Revised Statutes of Maine.
