Whereas the City Council of the City of Augusta have been petitioned by A. B. Farwell, and others to layout a street or road in said City:

Commencing at Green Street and running across the "Williams Purchase" so-called, and known as Cushman Street to and terminating at Western Avenue.

And the said Council at a session thereof, on the 30th day of December A.D., 1871, ordered the City Clerk to give notice of the intention of Council to layout said proposed street or road.

All persons interested are hereby notified to appear before a committee of said Council on the premises, on the 17th day of February, A.D., 1872 at two o'clock in the afternoon when and where said committee will proceed to layout the same.

REPORT, of Committee on New Streets.

The Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of A. B. Farwell et al, for a new street and upon which notice was ordered, have had the same under consideration and reports:

That the City Clerk gave notice to layout said street as prayed for from Green Street to, and terminating at Western Avenue which notice was posted in two public places in vicinity on the 10th day of February 1872 notifying all persons interested to appear before a Committee of said Council on the premises at two o'clock p.m. of the 17th day of February 1872 at which time and place your Committee met, and after viewing the route, hearing the petitioners, and considering the matter, laid out a public road on street as follows, viz:

Beginning at the south west corner of lot numbered 105 on a plan of house lots made by Abbott of the Williams Field owned by B. H. Cushman and others; thence running northerly on the east line of said lot number 105 and on the east line of lots number 94, 89, 82, 72, 60, 56, 49, 44, 33 and 22 on said plan eight hundred and twenty-two feet, to the south line of Green Street. Said street to be fifty feet wide, and on the east side of said line, and to be known and called Cushman Street.

On the 17th day of February 1872 your Committee filed with the City Clerk of said City the laying out of said street, with bounds and admeasurements of said street as above reported, and we have estimated the damages of laying out said street as follows, viz: No damages are claimed and none awarded, all of which is respectfully submitted.
