READ AND ACCEPTED

84 ORDERED, That the Street Commissioners for the Western District be and hereby is ordered forthwith to properly grade the place known as Butnam Place and render the same safe and convenient for public travel, and that the same be known in future as Dayton Place.

Read and Passed, Sent down for concurrence. Returned passed in concurrence.

The Joint Standing Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of E. C. Partridge and others for New Street

Report

That the prayer of petitioners be granted to this extent that said Butnam Place be accepted by the City namely from Green Street Southerly to land owned by Colby past the residences of Partridge, Vivian and others. But beyond that line to Lincoln Street so-called. The public good does not require it, and as it would necessarily involve considerable damage for land, we do not advise the laying out the road beyond the point above named.

Read and accepted, sent down for Concurrence. Returned, accepted in concurrence.
