READ AND PASSED~

At the annual meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta, qualified to vote in Town affairs, held by adjournment at the Town House on Monday the first day of April A.D. 1844 at ten o'clock in the forenoon.~

Under ARTICLE 16, the following report was submitted to wit; "We the undersigned being appointed a committee to examine into the propriety of altering the road laid out west of Charles Williams' old store, having had the same under consideration ask leave to report: That part of the road west of Daniel Sheridan's north line being twenty feet wide in consequence of its being used about that width as an open passage way for more than twenty years; and if it was laid out any wider there would be more damages. The road south of Sheridan's south line is thirty feet wide, being a reserve by the proprietors no damage claimed. Your committee have come to the conclusion that any alteration would be improper.

Which report being read VOTED that the same be accepted.~

VOTED, That the road referred to in the proceeding report be accepted agreeably to the report of the Selectmen of the laying out of the same, which is as follows, viz:~

Commencing at Winthrop Street two and a half feet west of the northwest corner of Luther Perkins' old store; thence South 30 degrees West 14 1/2 rods to a stake in Court Street. line west of said monuments. Said road lying west of said monuments. Said road south of Sheridan's north line is to Winthrop Street is twenty feet wide. All persons were notified and damages claimed by Alvah Josselyn.~

VOTED

VOTED, At a special meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta, duly notified and legally assembled, qualified according to law to vote in Town affairs, holden at the Town House in said Augusta on Saturday the 13th day of August A.D. 1842.~

ARTICLE 3 VOTED, To accept a road on the west side of Kennebec River as the same is laid out by the Selectmen on the petition of Thomas Wadsworth and others; described in their return of the laying out of the same as follows, viz:~

Beginning in the south line of Winthrop Street at a point by which a course of South 32 degrees West, will just clear the southwest corner of the building owned by Luther Perkins and formerly owned by Charles Williams; pursuing this course about ten and a half rods to the north line of Daniel Harriman and; thence South 25 degrees West about four and three fourth rods to the north line of Court Street. This road to be thirty feet wide and being on the west side of said line.~

All persons were notified, and damages claimed by I. Gage and Frederic Wingate.~
