READ AND PASSED

404 ORDERED, That the following described proposed street known as Eight Rod Rangeway be vacated under the following conditions:

1. That the Corporation Counsel be satisfied that the City does not owe the fee,
2. That the City be indemnified by such persons as the City Manager and Corporation Counsel deem appropriate against any damages arising out of the vacation,
3. That the area encompassed by Rockwood Road not be vacated.

A certain lot or parcel of land situated on the west side of the river in Augusta, Maine; Beginning at a point on the southerly side of the Eight Rod Rangeway, so-called, where the same is intersected by the northeasterly line of the Old Rockwood Road, so-called; thence North 16 degrees 30 minutes West along the northeasterly line of said Old Rockwood Road about 155 feet to its intersection with the extension southerly of the easterly line of Edison Drive, so-called; thence North 32 degrees 00 minutes East along the easterly line of said Edison Drive about 30 feet to the northerly side of the above mentioned Eight Rod Rangeway; thence South 59 degrees 31 minutes East along the northerly side of said Eight Rod Rangeway about 676 feet to a stone monument set in said northerly line of the Eight Rod Rangeway at the point where it intersects with the easterly line of the premises now owned by Central Maine Power Company and being the site of its Computer Center, so-called; thence South 22 degrees 56 minutes West 140 feet, more or less, to the southerly line of said Eight Rod Rangeway; thence North 59 degrees 31 minutes West along the southerly line of said Eight Rod Rangeway about 573 feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to convey all of interest in that part of the Right Rod Rangeway, so-called, that is situated between the easterly line of Central Maine Power Company land and the easterly line of Old Rockwood and Edison Drive.

READ AND PASSED

445 ORDERED, That Order #404 dated June 16, 1970 be amended as follows:

ORDERED, That the following described portion of a proposed street known as Eight Rod Rangeway be vacated pursuant to M.R.S.A., T.23, Sec. 3012, as amended, upon the petition of Construction Promoters, owners of land encompassed within the bonds of said rangeway:

A certain lot or parcel of land situated on the west side of the river in Augusta, Maine; Beginning at a point on the southerly side of the Eight Rod Rangeway, so-called, where the same is intersected by the northeasterly line of the Old Rockwood Road, so-called; thence North 16 degrees 30 minutes West along the northeasterly line of said Old Rockwood Road about 155 feet to its intersection with the extension southerly of the easterly line of Edison Drive, so-called; thence North 32 degrees 00 minutes East along the easterly line of said Edison Drive about 30 feet to the northerly side of the above mentioned Eight Rod Rangeway; thence South 59 degrees 31 minutes East along the northerly side of said Eight Rod Rangeway about 676 feet to a stone monument set in said northerly line of the Eight Rod Rangeway at the point where it intersects with the easterly line of the premises now owned by Central Maine Power Company and being the site of its Computer Center, so-called; thence South 22 degrees 56 minutes West 140 feet, more or less, to the southerly line of said Eight Rod Rangeway; thence North 59 degrees 31 minutes West along the southerly line of said Eight Rod Rangeway about 573 feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to convey all of interest in that part of the Eight Rod Rangeway, so-called, that is situated between the easterly line of Central Maine Power Company land and the easterly line of Old Rockwood and Edison Drive and specifically excepting and reserving the area encompassed by Rockwood Road; and

FURTHER ORDERED, That the municipal officers hereby assess the damages to adjoining and abutting owners to be \$0.00 as a result of the vacation; and

FURTHER ORDERED, That Petitioner may retract its said petition by delivering a written request to do so to the City Manager within sixty-five (65) days of the date of this Order, otherwise this action to be final.

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
