**POSSIBLE DEED
DESCRIPTION OF FIFTH AVENUE**

September 29, 1955

A certain lot or parcel of land situated on the east side of the river in Augusta, Maine and described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the easterly line of Hospital Street and said point being the northwest corner of Lot #22 according to "Plan of Eastern Heights" made by W. W. Hill, February 12, 1955; thence easterly along the southerly line of Fifty Avenue a distance of three hundred fifty feet (350') to the west line of Congress Street; thence northerly on Congress Street forty feet (40'); thence westerly on the north line of Fifth Avenue a distance of three hundred fifty feet (350') to the east line of Hospital Street; thence southerly on Hospital Street forty feet (40') to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to describe a parcel of land forty feet (40') wide and three hundred fifty feet (350') long between Hospital Street and Congress Street.

22 ORDERED, That Fifth Avenue, so-called, extending from easterly line of Congress Street for a distance of about 380 feet easterly be accepted as a City Street, said street to be 40 feet wide.

DESCRIPTION

A certain lot or parcel of land situated on the east side of the river in Augusta, Maine: Beginning at a point on the northerly side of Fifth Avenue, so-called, where the same is intersected by the easterly line of Congress Street, so-called; thence easterly in the southerly line of Lots No. 2, 16, 17, 18 and 19 about 382 feet to the westerly line of land now owned by Stanley Sproul; all as shown on Plan of Eastern Heights made by W. W. Hill Engineer dated February 12, 1955; thence southerly along the westerly line of said Sproul's land 40 feet; thence westerly along the northerly side of parcel "A" across the northerly end of Madison Street and along the northerly side of Lots 15 and 3 about 380 feet to the easterly side of Congress Street; thence northerly along the easterly side of Congress Street 40 feet to the point of beginning:

Meaning and intending to describe a parcel of land 40 feet wide and about 380 feet long extending from the easterly side of Congress Street to the westerly line of land of said Sproul to be used as a City Street known as Fifth Avenue.

POSSIBLE DEED

DESCRIPTION OF FIFTH AVENUE

A certain parcel or lot of land situated on the easterly side of the river in Augusta, Maine. Beginning at a point on the easterly line of Hospital Street and said point being two hundred feet (200') southerly of the southerly line of Fourth Avenue; thence in an easterly direction parallel with the southerly line of Fourth Avenue at an angle of 84 degrees 18 minutes with Hospital Street for a distance of three hundred fifty feet (350'); thence southerly at an angle of 95 degrees 42 minutes a distance of forty feet (40'); thence westerly at an angle of 84 degrees 18 minutes a distance of three hundred fifty feet (350') to the easterly line of Hospital

Street; thence northerly along the easterly line of Hospital Street a distance of forty feet (40') to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to describe a parcel of land three hundred fifty feet long easterly of the easterly line of Hospital Street and forty feet wide.
