VOTED

At the annual meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta, qualified to vote in Town affairs legally called and notified, held at the Town House on Monday the thirteenth day of March A.D. 1837.

ARTICLE 8 VOTED, To accept a street on the west side of Kennebec River agreeably to the location of the same by the Selectmen reported and described by them as follows, viz:

Commencing on the south side of the street leading from Greenwood C. Child's house easterly by the South Parish Meeting House and three hundred and eleven feet easterly of State Street at the northeast corner of John Greenleaf's land; thence extending southerly to Oak Street in a line parallel with State Street. Said road or street to be thirty feet wide and situated east of said line.

Previous to laying out said street all persons interested were duly and seasonably notified and no damages were either claimed or agreed upon by us to have been sustained.
