PETITION

STATE OF MAINE

Kennebec, SS

To James Black one of the Constables of Augusta within said County.

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to warn the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of the said Town of Augusta qualified to vote in town affairs to meet and assemble at the Town House on Monday the seventh day of March next, at half past ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following article, viz:

ARTICLE 14, To see if the Town will accept a road laid out by the Selectmen on the petition of Daniel Weston, et al.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Selectmen on or before the said day of meeting.

Given under our hands this twenty fourth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

March 7, 1842

VOTED

At a legal Annual Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta, qualified to vote in town affairs, holden at the Town House in said Town on Monday the seventh day of March A.D. 1842.

ARTICLE 14, VOTED, To accept a road on the west side of Kennebec River as the same is located by the Selectmen on the petition of Daniel Weston, Jr., and others - described in the report of said Selectmen as follows, viz:

Beginning at the southwest corner of Thomas Rines' old house on Water Street; thence South 11 degrees East 158 feet to a stake; thence South 11 degrees West 161 feet; thence South 18 degrees West 536 feet; thence South 26 degrees West 186 feet to the south line of the Gage lot. Said road to be 40 feet wide west of said line. Damages claimed by Thomas W. Smith. The parties were notified according to law.

On motion of Loring

VOTED, That when this meeting adjourns it adjourns to meet at this place on Monday the 21st day of March instant at ten o'clock in the forenoon.

VOTED, That this meeting now adjourn accordingly.

VOTED

ARTICLE 14 VOTED, We the undersigned believing it to be absolutely necessary for the public convenience, request you to layout a road leading across the Gage Tract, so-called, commencing on Water Street near where Thomas Rines now lives; thence in a southerly direction to the south line of the Gage Tract, so-called, and your petitioners will ever pray.

Agreeably to the within petition we the undersigned Selectmen laid out the following road. Beginning at the southwest corner of Thomas Rines' old house on Water Street; thence South 11 degrees East distance 158 feet to a stake; thence South 10 degrees West distance 161 feet; thence South 18 degrees West 536 feet; thence South 26 degrees West 186 feet to the south

line of the Gage lot. Said road to be 40 feet wide west of said line damages claimed by T. W. Smith. The parties were notified according to law.

VOTED

ARTICLE 3 VOTED, To accept an alteration in Gage Street agreeably to the report of the Selectmen of the laying out of the same; which report is as follows, viz: "Commencing at William K. Weston's, southwest corner on the east side of Gage Street and running north 3 degrees east to Water Street about 2 1/2 feet from the southwest corner of Thomas Rines' two story house. All parties were notified by posting up two notices seven days before said location. Damages on the alteration of Greene Street are claimed by Thomas W. Smith and Joshua B. Hartford and on the alteration of Gage Street damages are claimed by Thomas Rines."

A plan of the alterations of Greene and Gage Streets is on file.

VOTED

At a Special Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote in town affairs, legally notified and warned - assembled at the Town House on the 24th March A.D. 1845.

ARTICLES 2 and 3 VOTED, To the Selectmen of Augusta.

Gentlemen.

The undersigned citizens of said town respectfully represent that the public convenience and necessity imperiously require that Gage Street be extended and widened at the point of termination on Water Street and that Green Street near the same place be extended to Gage Street, and made wider on each side, and they therefore request that you will cause the same, or so much thereof as you deem necessary to be immediately done, and as in duty bound be.

We the undersigned Selectmen of Augusta have on the within petition laid out the following roads.

First a continuation of Green Street the full width to Gage Street.

Second commencing at William K. Weston's southwest corner on the east side of Gage Street and running North 3 degrees East to Water Street about 2 1/2 feet from the southwest corner of Thomas Rines' two story house.

All parties were notified by posting up two notices seven days before said locations. Damage on the alteration of Green Street claimed by Thomas W. Smith and Joshua Hartford - on the alteration of Gage Street damages claimed by Thomas Rines.

The Committee on New Streets have this day laid out a new street pursuant to an order of the City Council passed October 1st on the petition of Ira H. Randall and 128 others asking for the extension of Gage Street to Capitol Street and having fulfilled the requirements of the law report the location of said street as follows:

Begin in the East line of Gage Street at a point North 21 degrees East from a stone bound at the Northwest corner of Cathy L. Humphries lot about 30 rods from the South end of Gage Street as located and accepted March 9, 1842 and from thence continuing the same course South 21 degrees West three hundred feet to a stone bound in range with the South line of a private street called Child Street continued as contemplated by the present owners thence South 28 degrees West 68 1/2 feet to a stone bound in the North line of Capitol Street said street to be forty feet wide South of the first named stone bound and West of said line and North said street to be of the same width on the surface of the road when filled and wide enough at the bottom to include the fill across the gully.
