Know All Men by These Presents,

That We, Paul A. Cyr and Bernice E. Cyr, husband and wife, both of Augusta, County of Kennebec and State of Maine,

in consideration of one dollar and other valuable considerations

paid by the City of Augusta, County of Kennebec and State of Maine,

the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, a certain lot or parcel of land situated on the east side of the river in Augusta, Maine, described as follows, to wit:

Parcel No. 1.

Beginning on the northerly line of land of Paul A. Cyr as deeded to him by Harry C. Miller, January 26, 1948, and recorded in Kennebec County Registry of Deeds, Book 855, Page 165, and said point of beginning being a stone bound at the southeast corner of the "Quarry Lot" on South Belfast Avenue as shown on "Plan of Quarry Lot" made by A. G. Norcross, December, 1915; thence at an angle of 90 degrees with the said northerly line of Cyr a distance of three hundred ninety-five (395) feet, more or less, to the southerly line of said Cyr and it also being the line of Arthur Seth Raymond; thence at about a 90 degrees angle in an easterly direction to the easterly line of the said Cyr property; thence northerly on the said easterly line about three hundred ninety-five (395) feet, more or less, to the said northerly line of point of beginning. As shown on plan to be recorded in the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds.

Meaning and intending to describe that part of the Paul A. Cyr property east of a line perpendicular to his northerly line at the stone bound at the southeast corner of the "Quarry Lot."

Parcel No. 2

Beginning at the southeast corner of Lot No. 1 according to "Plan of Lots on Land of Harry C. Miller made by W. W. Hill, December 19, 1932; thence northerly on the easterly line of Lots 1 and 3 a distance of one hundred twenty (120) feet to the northeast corner of Lot No. 3; thence easterly at 90 degrees a distance of forty (40) feet to the northwest corner of Lot No. 4;

thence southerly at 90 degrees along the westerly line of Lots 4 and 2 a distance of one hundred twenty (120) feet to the southwest corner of Lot No. 2; thence westerly at 90 degrees a distance of forty (40) feet to the point of beginning, and said point being on the northerly line of Gilman Street.

Meaning and intending to describe a parcel of land forty (40) feet wide and one hundred twenty (120) feet long from the northerly line of Gilman Street to the northerly line of Lot No. 3.
