To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of the City of Augusta:~

The undersigned citizens and taxpayers of Augusta respectfully ask of your honorable body, that the street designated on Abbott and Capen's plan of Augusta Trotting Park, as Columbia Street, next east of State Street and leading from Union to Grand Street, so-called, be laid out and accepted by the City; and opened for public travel, it being a public necessity.

We further petition that Grand Street, between State and Columbia, so-called, be also made into a public highway. These streets have already been turn piked and in constant use, and would require little if any outlay.

Petitioned by 30 persons

The foregoing Petition was Read and Referred to the Committee on New Streets and Order of Notice Directed. Sent Down for Concurrence. It subsequently came back from the Common Council, Read and Referred to Committee on New Streets and Order of Notice Directed in Concurrence.

The Committee on New Streets, to whom was Referred the Petition of C. B. Burleigh and others for the laying out and acceptance of Columbia Street, hereby report that notices of a hearing on said matter were duly posted as required by the City Ordinances: that at the time and place appointed in said notices a hearing was given to all persons interested; that your Committee have laid out said street with the bounds and admeasurements of the same and hereby report the same to the City Council; that they recommend that said laying out with the bounds and admeasurements aforesaid, which were duly filed with the City Clerk more than seven days

prior to the date hereof, be accepted and allowed, provided that no land damages are claimed by reason thereof, the same being as follows, to wit:~

Beginning at a point in the south line of Union Street 250 feet easterly from the east line of State Street, measuring on the south line of Union Street; thence southerly parallel to said street 800 5/10 feet passing through the center of a stone bound on the north line of Grand Street, said Columbia Street to be 50 feet wide and easterly of the above described line. City of Augusta-
