PETITION

To the City Council of Augusta:

The undersigned respectfully represent that the private way extending from the Powder House on Granite Street running northerly past the house of Mrs. Powers and Sidney Arnold to Oliver's gate is of public use and convenience and that a public street is necessary extending from said Granite Street to said Oliver's gate. We therefore pray that such street may be laid out and properly graded as soon as practicable.

Report of Committee on New Streets

The Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of Nathan Oliver and others for a new street and upon which notice was ordered have had the same under consideration, and report:

That the City Clerk gave notice to layout said street as prayed for, from the Powder house on Granite Street to Oliver's gate, and terminating at such gate which notice was posted up in the Post Office and at the south end of the proposed street on the the third day of June 1869, notifying all persons interested to appear before a committee of such council at the house of Nathan Oliver at 2 o'clock p.m. of the 12th day of June 1869 at which time and place your committee met and after viewing the route, hearing the petitioners and considering the matters, laid out the public road and street as follows, viz:

From the north end of Granite Street at the Powder house and extending northerly to Oliver's gate. Said road shall be thirty eight feet wide at the Powder House and forty feet wide at the north end from the west line of the private way existing these.

On the 21st day of June 1869, your committee filed with the City Clerk of such City. The laying out of said street, with the Grounds and Admeasurements of said street, above reported, and we have estimated the damages of laying out said street, as follows, viz:

READ AND PASSED

A-82 ORDERED, That notice be given in accordance with Chapter XI of the Revised Ordinances for the laying out and acceptance of Granite Street Extension as described below, and hearing thereon to be held before the Highway Committee:

Beginning at a point in the east line of Granite Street as now established, 62.1 feet north of Bennett Street; thence northeasterly 28 feet, more or less, to a point; thence North 1 degree East 214 feet more or less to a point; thence North 60 degrees 59 minutes West 50 feet, more or less, to a point; thence North 70 degrees 29 minutes West 49 feet, more or less, to a point; thence South 19 degrees 31 minutes West 40 feet to a point in Bernard Ellis' north line; thence South 70 degrees 29 minutes East 42 feet, more or less, to a point; thence South 60 degrees 59 minutes East 27.72 feet; thence South 1 degrees 01 minutes West 178 feet, more or less, to a point; thence southerly 18 feet, more or less, to a point in the present northerly termination of Granite Street; thence easterly 40 feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to accept as a City Street, a strip of land forty feet wide extending in a northerly direction from the present termination of Granite Street to land of Ralph Kittredge and Bernard Ellis. Said street to be a part of and known as Granite Street.
