Said street to be 40 feet wide.

**Description**

A certain lot or parcel of land situated on the west side of the river in Augusta, Maine:

Beginning at a point on the westerly side of State Street, so-called, at the northeast corner of Lot #134 as shown on Plan of Belmont Park on file at the Kennebec Registry of Deeds; thence North 62 degrees 48 minutes West along the northerly side of Lots #134, 133 Cherry Street, so-called, Lots #132 and 131 a distance of 420 feet to the northwest corner of Lot #131; thence North 27 degrees 12 minutes East along the easterly side of South Grove Street, so-called, 40 feet to the southwest corner of Lot #170; thence South 62 degrees 48 minutes East along the southerly side of Lots #170, 169, 153 Cherry Street, so-called, Lots #152 and 135 to the southeast corner of Lot #135; thence southerly along the westerly side of State Street, so-called, 40 feet to the point of beginning.
