April 1, 1839

VOTED

At a special meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta legally called and notified.  
Held at the Town House on the first day of April A.D., 1839.

ARTICLE 3, To the Selectmen of the Town of Augusta

The undersigned respectfully represent that a road leading from the new road to the old North Belfast Road west of the house now occupied by William Brackett would be an accommodation to the public, and therefore request that a road may be laid out in the most convenient place aforesaid, that the same may be accepted by the Town at their next meeting.

The undersigned have this day laid out a road on the within petition as follows, viz:

Commencing in the north line of the county road leading to Asa Bartlett's at the south end of a board fence; thence North sixteen degrees west about sixty-five rods to a stake in the north line of Ruell William's land; thence North 19 degrees West sixty-eight rods to a stake in the south line of the Belfast Road, said road to be four rods wide, and east of said line. All persons interested were notified previous to the laying out of the same.

VOTED

ARTICLE 19 VOTED, To accept a road on the east side of Kennebec River laid out on petition of Abraham Cappers and others, agreeably to the report of the Selectmen, provided no damages are claimed by any person except the heirs of the late Howard Pettingill. To wit: "Commencing in the north line of the New Belfast road at a stake; thence north 15 1/2 degrees west, sixty five rods to a point in the north line of land of Reuel Williams, one rod and ten links north easterly from the house of Abraham Cappers; thence north 16 1/2 degrees west, sixty eight rods to the Old Belfast Road. Said road to be three rods wide east of the above line."

VOTED

At the Annual Meeting of the Inhabitants of Augusta qualified to vote in Town affairs holden at the Town House in said Augusta (according to notice duly and legally given) on Monday the first day of March and by adjournment March 22, 1847.

ARTICLE 19, To the Selectmen of Augusta.

The undersigned respectfully represent, that a Town road leading from the Old Belfast Road, near the house of Levi Hicks, to the New Belfast Road, near the house of Thomas Bartlett is very much needed, and request you to locate the same, and lay your doings before the Town, at their next annual meeting, for their acceptance.

The undersigned Selectmen of Augusta have this day located the following roads, viz:

Commencing on the north line of the (south) New Belfast Road, at a stake; thence North 15 1/2 degrees West 65 rods distant, to a point in the north line of lands of Ruel Williams, one rod and ten links north east from the house of Abraham Cappers; thence North 16 1/2 degrees West 68 rods, distant, to the Old Belfast Road.



Report of Committee on New Streets.

The Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of Eben Baker and others for a new street, and upon which notice was ordered have had the same under consideration and report.

That the City Clerk give notice to layout said street, as prayed for, from the Old Belfast Road to and terminating at which notice was posted on the School House in district, and one near the south end of the proposed road and upon a pine tree on the first day of June 1859, notifying all persons interested to appear before a Committee of said Council at the house of Levi Hicks at two o'clock p.m. of the 8<sup>th</sup> day of June instant at which time and place your Committee met, and after viewing this route, hearing the petitioners and considering the matter laid out a public road or street as follows, viz:

Commencing at a stake near the south line of the Old Belfast Road; thence running South forty-one degrees East four rods to a stake; thence South seventeen degrees East twenty-two rods to the south east corner of land of James Savage as now fenced; thence South fifteen degrees East, about one hundred and eleven rods to the north line of the New Belfast Road said road to be three rods wide and east of said line. On the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1859 your Committee filed with the City Clerk of said City, the laying out of said street with the bounds and admeasurements of said street as above reported, and we have estimated the damages of laying out said street as follows, viz:

On the foregoing Petition the usual seven days notice was given by the City Clerk notifying all persons interested to appear before the Committee on New Streets at the house of Benjamin Young in said Augusta near the proposed location at 3 o'clock p.m., on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1880 when and where said Committee would layout said road or street.

The Standing Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of Benjamin Young and others for a new road from the New to the Old Belfast Road on land of the heirs of the late Honorable Ruel Williams and others, upon which the City Clerk was on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 1880 ordered to give notice of the laying out of the same.

Report

That pursuant to the notice of the City Clerk copies of which were posted by the City Marshal in two public and conspicuous places in the vicinity of said proposed road on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May 1880 as appears by his return on the notice herewith returned, a meeting was held at the time and place named in said notice, the premises viewed and we have laid out said road as follows:

Beginning at a stone bound in the north line of the (south) New Belfast Road; thence running North fifteen degrees West , one hundred and thirty-two and a quarter rods more or less to an iron bolt, driven in the ground on land of Levi Hicks; thence North forty-eight degrees West, six rods and twenty-two links to the third cedar post in the railing on the south side of the (north) Old Belfast Road, at the foot of which on the north side an iron bolt is driven in the ground. Said road to be three rods wide and on the easterly side of said line and the easterly line is to be continued straight through to the Old Belfast Road, the westerly line passes through the center of a cedar post at the southeast corner of land of J. N. Patterson. The accompanying plan shows the names of the owners or occupants of the land over or through which said road is laid and about the distance of each on the road. No person appeared to claim damages and no damages have been awarded by us, the location was commenced May 20, and finished June 1<sup>st</sup>, 1880.
