346 ORDERED, That Jefferson Street Place, so-called, be accepted as a City Street. Said street to be 36 feet wide.

**Description**

Beginning at a point on the northerly side of Jefferson Street, so-called, at the southeasterly corner of land now or formerly owned by Raymond G. Robichaud; thence northeasterly along the easterly line of land owned by said Robichaud and the easterly line of land owned by Alfred J. Lacasse about 185 feet to the southerly line of land now or formerly owned by Joseph A. Genest; thence easterly along the southerly line of land owned by said Genest about 40 feet to the westerly line of land owned by Armand Lajoie; thence southwesterly along the westerly line of land owned by said Armand Lajoie and land now or formerly owned by Raphael Gagne about 200 feet to the northerly side of Jefferson Street; thence westerly along the northerly side of said Jefferson Street 36 feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to accept as a City Street the right-of-way shown as Jefferson Place on Plan of Kennebec Locks and Canals Company No. 2 made by B. F. Chandler in 1846 as recorded in Book 1, Page 39 at the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds. Said street to be 36 feet wide and known as Jefferson Street Place.
