In Board of Aldermen

August 17, 1903

To the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Augusta:

The undersigned citizens of Augusta do respectfully petition that Bedford and Johnson Streets so-called, from Green Street South to Lincoln Street shall be laid out and accepted by the said City. These streets being a matter of public necessity, a new school building being now in process of erection. They further petition that sidewalks be constructed upon said streets.

The foregoing Petition was Read and Referred to the Committee on Highways and Sewers and order of notice directed. Thereon In Concurrence with the Action of the Common Council.

Pursuant to the action of the City Council the following notice was given.

State of Maine
City of Augusta, SS

WHEREAS, application is made to the City Council of said Augusta to layout two new streets in said City, to wit: Bedford and Johnson Streets, so-called, leading from Green Street, its northern terminus, south to Lincoln Street, its southern, terminus, and WHEREAS said City Council has directed an order of notice upon such application.

ALL PERSONS INTERESTED are therefore notified of the intention of the City Council to layout said street, and are hereby further notified to appear before the Joint Committee of the City Council on Highways and Sewers, a committee of the City Council having the matter in charge at the Aldermen's Rooms, City Building in said Augusta on September 17, A.D. 1903 at 7:30 o'clock p.m. at which time and place a hearing relative to the proposed laying out of said streets will be had.

Beginning at a stone monument in the north line of Lincoln Street, so-called said monument being 320 feet westerly from the westerly line of Bedford Street, so-called measured on the northerly line of said Lincoln Street, from said first named stone monument running North 27 degrees, 30 minutes East, parallel with said Bedford Street, four hundred and one half (400.5) feet, to a stone monument in the southerly line of Green Street. Said Johnson Street to be 50 feet wide and is to be the westerly side of the above described line.

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

The same committee to which was referred the petition relating to the laying out of Johnson and Bedford Streets, reported the same was a public necessity, and recommended in passage of the accompanying order, which herewith follows.

ORDERED, That Johnson and Bedford Streets, as laid out by the plan and surveyors description attached, be accepted by the City.

The foregoing report was accepted, the order given a passage and both sent down for concurrence, coming back later accepted and passed respectively in concurrence. (For surveyor's description see Book on Streets, and plan which is on file.)

Council Order 156

JOHNSON STREET

Read and Passed August 16, 1965

WHEREAS, the Augusta Municipal Officers have received a Petition brought by John F. Turner for the vacation of the following land lying in said Augusta, between Western Ave. and Lincoln Street, and

WHEREAS, due notice has been proved and the Municipal Officers are satisfied as the allegations of said Petition and proof, thereunder, Be it ordered that the following street be vacated under the Provisions of Section 3012 of Title 23, of the Maine Revised Statutes Annotated. Said street being bounded and described as follows, to wit:

A certain stip of land fifty (50) feet in width extending southerly from Lincoln Street to Western Avenue and shown as a part of Johnson Street, on a certain plan filed in Kennebec Registry of Deeds in Plan Book 1, Page 50, entitled: "Plat of House Lots in Augusta, Maine (known as the Williams Field) belonging to B.H.Cushman and others". The northerly part of said strip is also delineated on another certain plan filed in said Registry of Deeds in Plan Book 2, Page 2, entitled "The Williams Field so-called Augusta, Maine", dated December 7, 1885.
