VOTED

At a special meeting of the inhabitants of Augusta qualified by law to voted in Town affairs, legally notified and warned, assembled at the Town House in said Augusta on the 22nd day of March 1847 at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 2, To the Selectmen of Augusta:

The undersigned respectfully submit that a townway is needed for public convenience.

Commencing at a point of the County Roads east of the river near the shop of Col. Henry Sawyer thence in a south westerly course to Kennebec River; thence southerly to the south line of Benjamin Getchell's land and request you to lay it out accordingly.

Pursuant to the above petition of the Selectmen of Augusta after giving due notice have this day located the following road, viz:

Commencing at a stake and stone in the south line of land of Benjamin Getchell; thence running North 30 degrees East 20 rods to the northeast corner of W. R. Libbey's house; thence North 23 ½ degrees East 8 rods to a hemlock tree; thence North 42 degrees East 12 rods to a birch stake; thence South 64 degrees East 27 rods to a stake and stone; thence North 77 degrees East 16 rods to a stake; thence South 78 degrees East 12 rods to a stake; thence South 88 degrees East 10 rods; thence North 78 degrees East 12 rods; thence South 79 degrees East 19 rods; thence South 62 degrees East forty-two rods to County Road.

Said road to be 2 ½ rods wide and lying easterly and southerly of the above line.

ARTICLE 17, To the Selectmen of the Town of Augusta:

Gentlemen:

The undersigned Inhabitants of said Town hereby represent that a road leading from the River Road south of Henry Sawyer's house, over the passageway now used to James Tibbett's land and to connect with the road about to be located on Petition of William Kennedy and others, in such place as you shall on examination think best, would be of public convenience and same making part of the road petitioned for by said Kennedy and others; they therefore request that you would layout a road as above represented and lay your proceedings before the Town at their annual meeting for acceptance.

To wit: "Commencing at a stake and stone in the south line of land of Benjamin Getchell; thence running North 30 degrees East 20 rods to the north east corner of W. R. Know All Men by These Presents,

That I, Henry Clark Knox, of Monson, in the County of Piscataquis and State of Maine

in consideration of one dollar and other valuable consideration

paid by the City of Augusta, a municipal corporation, in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine,

the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby remise, release, bargain, sell and convey, and forever quit-claim unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, all my right, title and interest in and to a certain lot or parcel of land situated in said City of Augusta, bounded and described as follows:

On the east side of the Kennebec River commencing twenty feet north of northeast corner of house occupied by the late Andrew J. Getchell and Lucretia S. Getchell, and running north on road west of said house seventy feet, thence west to a path running parallel with the Kennebec River sixty feet; thence south on said path sixty-five feet, thence east to the first mentioned bounds fifty feet; together with all the privileges and rights of and to said river, being the same property conveyed to me by Betsey M. Page by her deed of August 23, 1923, recorded in the Kennebec Registry of Deeds, Book 608, Page 550.
