READ AND PASSED

A-88 ORDERED, That Kennison Street be accepted as a City street, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Eastern Avenue, sixty feet (60') westerly of the northwesterly corner of the Augusta Homes, Inc. Lot; thence southwesterly across land of Titcomb to the northwest corner of Lot 20 in Westview Park addition; thence southwesterly on the same course and by the westerly line of Lots 20, 19, 18, 17, 16, 15, 14 and 13, a total distance of one thousand and twenty-three and thirty-seven hundreds feet (1023.37'), more or less, to the northerly side of Fourth Avenue; thence westerly thirty-five (35) feet to the southeasterly corner of Lot 10, in Westview addition; thence northeasterly by the easterly line of Lots 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2 and across land of Titcomb to the southerly line of Eastern Avenue; thence easterly thirty-five (35) feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to accept Kennison Street with a width of thirty-five (35) feet, and extending southeasterly from Eastern Avenue to the northerly line of Fourth Avenue. As delineated on "Plan of Kennison Street", dated May 9, 1949, and made by the Augusta Highway Department.

That I, Conrad Kennison of Augusta, in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine

in consideration of one dollar and other valuable consideration

paid by the City of Augusta, a body corporate and politic, situated in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine

the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, a certain lot or parcel of land beginning at the northwesterly corner of Lot 20, as shown on "Revised Plan of Westview Park and Additions," made by Waldo W. Hill, dated May 7, 1947; thence southwesterly by the westerly line of Lots 20, 19, 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, and 13 to the northerly line of Fourth Avenue; thence westerly by the northerly line of Fourth Avenue, thirty-five (35) feet to the southeasterly corner of Lot 10; thence, northeasterly by the easterly line of Lots 10, 9, 8,7,6,5,4,3,and 2, to the northeasterly corner of Lot 2; thence, easterly thirty-five (35) feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to convey that strip of land, thirty-five (35) feet in width, designated on above mentioned plan as Kennison Street.

Know All Men by These Presents,

That Titcomb Real Estate Association, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maine, and located at Augusta, in the County of Kennebec, and State of Maine,

in consideration of one dollar and other valuable consideration,

paid by the City of Augusta, a municipal corporation, in the County of Kennebec, and State of Maine,

the receipt whereof it does hereby acknowledge, does hereby remise, release, bargain, sell and convey, and forever quit-claim unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, a certain lot and parcel of land situated on the south side of Eastern Avenue in said Augusta, and more particularly bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of Eastern Avenue, sixty (60) feet westerly of the northwesterly corner of the Augusta Homes, Inc. lot; thence southwesterly by a line

parallel with the westerly line of the Augusta Homes lot and sixty feet westerly therefrom to the northwesterly corner of Lot #20 in Westview Addition, a distance of two hundred and seven and twenty-five hundredths feet (207.25') more or less; thence westerly by the northerly line of Westview Park Addition thirty-five (35) feet; thence northeasterly by a line parallel with the first described line and thirty-five feet westerly therefrom to the southerly line of Eastern Avenue; thence by the southerly line of Eastern Avenue thirty-five (35) feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to convey a strip of land thirty-five (35) feet in width extending southeasterly from Eastern Avenue to the northerly line of Westview Park Addition, said strip of land being shown on "Revised Plan of Westview Park and Additions", made by Waldo W. Hill, dated May 7, 1947, and said strip of land being designated as a proposed street and would be a continuation of Kennison Street.
