A certain lot or parcel of land situated on the east side of the river in Augusta, Maine. Beginning at a point on the southerly line of Cony Street and said point being the northeast corner of Lot 4 according to "Plan of Property of C. B. and W. R. O'Connor" made by Henry F. Hill and dated August 23, 26, 1947 and recorded at the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds; thence along the southerly line of Cony Street a distance of 40 feet; thence southerly along the easterly line of said Kling Street a distance of (250') two hundred and fifty feet; thence westerly a distance of 40 feet; thence northerly in a line parallel to the easterly line of said Kling Street a distance of two hundred and fifty (250') to the point of beginning.

Know All Men by These Presents,

That we, William R. O'Connor and Charles B. O'Connor, both of Augusta, in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine,

in consideration of one dollar and other valuable considerations,

paid by the City of Augusta, a body politic and corporate, having its office in said Augusta,

the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, a certain lot or parcel of land, for use for City Streets, said parcel being bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at an iron pin on the southerly side of Cony Street, in said Augusta, and continuing in a southerly direction along the easterly line of Kling Street according to plan of property of Charles B. O'Connor and William R. O'Connor, dated August 23-26, 1947, made by Henry F. Hill, C.E. and recorded in Kennebec County Registry of Deeds, to a point fifty feet north of the northerly line of land now or formerly owned by William P. Viles, said point being in the westerly line of Lot No. 19 according to said plan; thence at right angle and continuing in a westerly direction a distance of fifty feet to a point in the easterly line of Lot 18 according to said plan; thence continuing in a northerly direction along the easterly line of said Lot 18 to the northeasterly corner of said Lot 18; thence continuing in a northerly direction to the southeasterly corner of Lot 5; thence continuing in a northerly direction along the easterly lines of Lot 5 and 4 to the southerly line of Cony Street; thence at about right angle and continuing in an easterly direction along the southerly line of Cony Street a distance of forty feet to the point of beginning.
