The Committee to whom was referred the Petition of Samuel C. Gage and others for the extension and widening of Laurel Street have had that subject under consideration and ask leave to report.

That in conformity with a notice posted up on the 22nd day of April 1851 in two public places in the vicinity of the proposed alteration, of the intention of the City Council to layout the same on the 30th day of April at 2 o'clock p.m. at the house of S. C. Gage; two of your Committee met at the time and place, they not being a majority, adjourned to Saturday the 3rd day of May at 4 o'clock p.m. when they met and proceeded to layout the same as follows, viz:

Bounds and Admeasurements

Beginning at an angle on the north line of Laurel Street in front of the School House on said street and running a westerly course as it now runs from Water Street, until it strikes the east line of the proposed extension of State Street; being about 165 feet and including all between the south line of the present location and the south line of the old location.

There is no damage claimed on this street, except by Asa Redington and G. A. Blake, to whom your Committee award fifty-five dollars.

Your Committee believe this road can be built for much less than it will take to repair the old one and be much more convenient for the people living on said street as well as those who may have occasion to travel it.

The Joint Standing Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of Cyrus Fellows and others for establishing the south line of Laurel Street, Report:

That in accordance with an order of the City Council passed October 20, 1877, we have laid out the south line of Laurel Street as follows, to wit;

Commencing at a point in the east line of State Street fifty-seven feet south of the intersection of the north line of Laurel Street with the east line of State Street; thence running South 78 degrees East eight rods and nine links to a point forty feet south of the north line of Laurel Street directly opposite and in range of the westerly line of Mrs. Taylor's lot; from thence running easterly parallel with the north line of Laurel Street and distant therefrom forty feet until it meets the south line of said street as formerly located and continuing the same course to Water Street. Notice of our meeting held on 27th day of October 1877 at 2 o'clock p.m. having been given by the City Clerk as appears by the notice herewith returned and our doings being filed with the City Clerk seven days to this date.
