READ AND PASSED

195 ORDERED, That Littlefield Street, description below, be accepted as a City Street.

Beginning at a point on the westerly side of Sewall Street, said point being North 23 degrees 44 minutes East 194 feet from the intersection of said westerly side of Sewall Street and the northerly side of Hancock Street; thence North 66 degrees 16 minutes West 360 feet; thence South 23 degrees 44 minutes West 50 feet; thence North 66 degrees 16 minutes West 40 feet; thence North 23 degrees 44 minutes East 140 feet; thence South 66 degrees 16 minutes East 40 feet; thence South 23 degrees 44 minutes West 50 feet; thence South 66 degrees 16 minutes East 360 feet to the westerly side of Sewall Street; thence South 23 degrees 44 minutes West 40 feet along the westerly side of Sewall Street to the point of beginning. This street is shown on Additions to Forest Park Development, filed in the Kennebec Registry of Deeds, Book 20, Page 46, and Book 22, Page 1.

Know All Men by These Presents,

That I, Stanley A. Smith, of Augusta, in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine

in consideration of the sum of one dollar and other valuable consideration

paid by the City of Augusta, a body corporate and politic, duly organized and existing by law and being located at Augusta, County of Kennebec and State of Maine the receipt whereof I

do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, certain lots or parcels of land situated in said Augusta in Forest Park Development, so-called, to wit: six streets known as Osgood, Murdock, Baldwin, Mayhew, Hancock and Littlefield Streets, each measuring forty (40) feet in width and four hundred (400) feet in length, and running westerly from Sewall Street to Waddington Street, so-called, as delineated on Plan of said Forest Park, W. W. Hill, Engineer, dated January 7, 1957, and recorded in Kennebec Registry of Deeds in Plan Book 20, Page 46, to which reference is hereby made.

The above described premises are conveyed subject to the restriction that they are to be used solely for street purposes.

Being a portion of the same premises conveyed to me by warranty deed of Francis H. Farnum, Trustee under the will of William H. Gannett dated November 2, 1956, and recorded in Kennebec Registry of Deeds in Book 1050, Page 205.
