March 20, 1843

VOTED

At the Annual Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta duly notified, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs; and legally held at the Town House in said Augusta, by adjournment on Monday the 20th day of March A.D.1843.

ARTICLE 9, To Loring Cushing, Thomas Little and Ephraim Ballard.Selectmen of Augusta.

We the undersigned request you to layout a road beginning at the south line of the Thomaston Road and crossing land of Henry Chadwick, Henry and Alfred Davenport and Charles L and Samuel T. Clark to the north line of the lot on which Thomas Young lives, and lay the same before the Town for their acceptance at the annual meeting next spring.

Augusta July 25th, 1842.

Signed Thomas Young and six others

Upon this petition the undersigned have laid out a road as follows, viz:

Beginning in the south line of the Thomaston Road, at a stake on the south line of Henry Chadwick; thence South 25 degrees West 140 rods to the north line of land on which Thomas Young now lives. The stake and line above named being in west line of the road, which we laid three rods wide. Henry Chadwick claims damage if the town accepts said road.

VOTED, To accept a road on the east side of the Kennebec River agreeably to the location of the same by the Selectmen recorded above.
