READ AND ACCEPTED

A-376 ORDERED, That Madison Street northerly from Sixth Avenue 100 feet, be accepted as a City Street. Said street to be 40 feet wide.

A certain lot or parcel of land on the east side of the river in Augusta, Maine and described as follows; to wit:

Beginning at a point on the north side of Sixth Avenue and being the southeast corner of Lot #13 according to "Plan of Eastern Heights" made February 12, 1955 by W. W. Hill; thence northerly along the easterly line of Lot #31 and a part of Lot #14 a distance of one hundred feet (100'); thence easterly forty feet (40') to the westerly line of Parcel "A"; thence southerly along the westerly line of Parcel "A" a distance of one hundred feet (100') to the north line of Sixth Avenue; thence westerly forty feet (40') to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to describe a parcel of land one hundred feet (100') long and forty feet (40') wide extending northerly from Sixth Avenue.

READ AND PASSED

ORDER 21, Beginning at a point on the southerly side of Fifth Avenue, so-called, located 200 feet easterly of the easterly side of Congress Street, so-called; thence southerly in a line parallel with the easterly line of said Congress Street 100 feet; thence easterly in a line parallel with the southerly line of said Fifth Avenue 40.2 feet; thence northerly parallel with the easterly line of said Congress Street 100 feet to the southerly side of Fifth Avenue; thence westerly in the southerly line of Fifth Avenue 40.2 feet to the point of beginning:

Meaning and intending to describe a parcel of land 40 feet wide and 100 feet in length extending southerly from Fifth Avenue to be known as a part of Madison Street.
