VOTED

To his Honor, the Mayor and Aldermen and Gentlemen of the City Council of the City of Augusta.

The undersigned respectfully ask your acceptance of a Private Way leading from Laurel Street northwardly between the Piper house and the house of Eben Packard to the houses of William Gage and Mrs. Hapgood; thence westwardly between the houses William Gage and Mrs. Hapgood to the houses of Mr. M. Stone Jr., and house occupied by Misters Clark and Bickford thence; southerly by the houses of A. H. Getchell and Samuel Burbank to Laurel Street, the first section of the above lane being 20 feet wide and the remainder 14 feet wide.

The same to be named and designated hereafter as Morton Street, no claim for damages.

Ald. Gaslin presented the following Order.

Viz.: Ordered, That the petition of Eben Packard and others praying for the Acceptance by the City of the private way leading from Laurel Street Northerly between the Piper House and the house of Eben Packard to the house of Wm. Gage and Mrs. Hapgood to the houses of M. M. Stone Jr. & house occupied by Messers Clark and Bickford; thence southerly by the houses of A.H. Getchells and Samuel Burbank to Laurel Street, the first section of said line or private way to be 20 feet and the remainder there of 14 feet, be referred to the Committee on New Streets and notice thereon is hereby ordered, and said Committee are hereby directed to lay out said private way and accept the same as prayed for in said petition.
