That I, William H. Gannett of Augusta, in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine,

in consideration of one dollar and other valuable considerations,

paid by City of Augusta, a municipal corporation located within said County and State,

the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, all of that part and portion of land described as Mulliken Court, on a plan of lots belonging to William H. Gannett, made by Henry F. Hill, July and August, 1938 and recorded in Kennebec Registry of Deeds, with whatever rights said Grantor has, in and to, the right-of-way as now used and connecting the westerly end of said Mulliken Court with the highway constructed by the State of Maine, leading northerly from Western Avenue to Camp Keyes.
