To the Selectmen of the Town of Augusta

The undersigned, petitioners beg leave to represent that the public convenience requires that a street should be laid out and opened and extending northerly from Winthrop Street towards the house lately erected by Jonathan Bennett and in front of the house now occupied by Joseph G. Moody, and embraced in the limits following, Viz:

Beginning in the northerly line of Winthrop Street, at a point just thirteen rods westerly from the westerly line of Spring Street so-called, which adjoins the land of Charles Keene on the westerly side thereof; thence running northerly in a line parallel with said westerly line of Spring Street and keeping the distance of thirteen rods westerly therefrom about thirty -eight rods to the northerly line of land owned by Chas. Hamlin; thence Westerly in the course of said Hamlin's north line to a point where same intersects a line parallel with the westerly line of Spring Street and distant thirteen rods and forty feet therefrom; thence southerly in last said named line to the north line of Winthrop Street; thence easterly in the north line of Winthrop Street forty feet to the point begun at. The street now prayed for being forty feet wide, and parallel with said Spring Street, and extending from Winthrop Street to the street contemplated on the northerly line of said Hamlin's land.

Wherefore the undersigned pray that the same may be examined and laid out accordingly and as in duty bound.
