April 25, 1854

To the Honorable Mayor, Aldermen and Common Council of the City of Augusta, would respectfully represent that the public convenience and wants require that road and highway should be laid out and constructed beginning at the Sidney Road in the City of Augusta and leading in a northerly direction to Monroe Street in said City: The street which we ask for is called Oxford Street. Your petitioners would therefore ask that your honor would view the premises and locate and construct said road and highway according to the laws in such cases made and provided.

The Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of George Stevens and others for a new street to be called Oxford Street have attended with subject matter of the petition would report.

That your Committee has proceeded as directed to layout said street by posting up a notice at the store of D. Moore in the vicinity of said street on the 2nd day of September being seven

days before the time of laying out. Having met at the time and place appointed we proceeded to layout said street as follows, viz:

Commencing on Sidney Street at the southeast corner of Willard Pages' land running North twenty and one half degrees East 60 rods and 4 feet to Monroe Street over the land of the Water Power Company's said street to be four rods wide and lying east of said line and being the same as laid down on the plan of said Water Power Company and that no damages are claimed by said Company. Also a certificate of the laying out of said road having been filed with the City Clerk seven days prior to this day all of which is respectfully submitted.
