**READ AND PASSED**

Notice is hereby given as required by the Revised Ordinances of the City of Augusta of a hearing to be held before the Municipal Officers at the Council Room on December 16<sup>th</sup>, 1940 at 7:30 P.M. to consider the acceptance of Oxford Street Extension as a City street. Boundaries as follows:

Commencing at a stone bound on the northerly side of Monroe Street at the southeast corner of land owned by Joseph Vachon said point being 600.75 feet easterly from the easterly line of Northern Avenue measured along the northerly line of Monroe Street; thence northerly along easterly line of land owned by said Joseph Vachon, E. and A. Lausier, A. and E. Lizotte across River Street, along easterly line of A. and M. Labbe, Joseph Perreault, G. and A. Marceau, A. Dostie across High Street, and along easterly line of E. Soucie, American Land Company, Phillip Crapeault and Vinton Dunn 1060 feet to Buena Vista Park, so-called; thence easterly along the southerly line of Buena Vista Park 50 feet to land of Wilfred Patnaude; thence southerly along westerly line of land of said Patnaude crossing High and River Streets and along westerly line of E. Cote 1060 feet to the northerly line of Monroe Street 50 feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to describe a strip of land 50 feet wide known as Oxford Street Extension extending from Monroe Street to Buena Vista Park a total distance of 1060 feet all as shown on plan called Plan of Oxford Street Extension made by Waldo W. Hill, City Engineer and dated December 5, 1940 on file in the City Clerk's Office.

A-13, Application for the laying out and establishing of a new street now known as Oxford Street Extension so-called, having been duly made, it is hereby

ORDERED, That the application be referred to the Joint Standing Committee on Highways and Sewers as the Committee having the matter in charge and that the City Clerk, under the direction of such Committee, cause written notices of the intention of the City Council to layout or alter the same, stating the termini of such public way or street, and notifying all persons interested to appear at a stated time and place before the said Committee, to be posted up in two or more public places in the City, in the vicinity of the proposed way or street, seven days at least before the time of meeting of the Committee aforesaid, and by causing a copy of such written notice to be published in the Daily Kennebec Journal; and that said Committee report its action as to laying out such street and the bounds and admeasurement of the same to the City Council together with an estimate of damages any individuals may sustain by such laying out.
