VOTED

At the annual meeting of the Inhabitants of Augusta, legally called and notified, held at Winthrop Hall in said Town on Monday the 12th day of March 1849 and by adjournment also on Monday the 2nd day of April A.D. 1849.

ARTICLE 18, To the Selectmen of Augusta

Gentlemen:

The undersigned hereby request you to layout a road commencing at the east line of Bangor Street, nearly opposite the Coney Female Academy Boarding House; thence running easterly as far as Joseph F. Gannett's west line; thence northerly as far as A. B. Fellows' south line; thence westerly to Bangor Street of such width as in your opinion will be necessary for the accommodation of the inhabitants, thereon and report your doings hereon to the Town at their next meeting for acceptance.

February 10, 1849

Signed Joseph F. Gannett and 7 others

In pursuance of the within petition we have this day laid out the road petitioned for, to wit: Commencing at a stone post in the east line of Bangor Street; thence South 65 degrees East, five hundred feet to a cedar post; thence North twenty-five degrees East, three hundred and ninety-four feet to a cedar post; thence North 65 degrees West, four hundred and fourteen feet

to the southwest corner of L. Farrington's Store on Bangor Street, the first five hundred feet lying north of said monument, and to be forty feet wide, three hundred ninety-four feet laying west and four hundred and fourteen feet of said road laying south of said monument, and to be forty feet wide, all persons were legally notified and no damages are claimed.

90 ORDERED, That Street Commissioners in Eastern District be and is hereby authorized and directed to cause the small lot of land at junction of Patterson Street and South Belfast Road on south side of Patterson Street which lies to the north and east of a line drawn between the maple tree on South Belfast Road and the maple tree on Patterson Street provided James Hermond the owner thereof will devise same to the City for use of City to be leveled and made part of City Highway under direction of Joint Standing Committee on Highways.

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

PETITION of Maude M. Mosher and sixty-eight (68) others for the grading and widening of Patterson Street was read and referred to the Committee on Highways and Sewers; like action was taken on petition of Smith S. Randall and fifty-one (51) others for the laying out and accepting as a public highway the Murray Street extension, so-called; both of these petitions were dealt with as above and sent down for concurrence, coming back later read and referred in concurrence.
