REPORT OF HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

A-318 ORDERED, That the City Clerk be and is hereby directed to give written notice, pursuant to Section 1 of Chapter XI of the Revised Ordinances, of the intention of the City Council to lay-out as a City Street the following described property, notifying all persons interested to appear October 18, 1948 at City Hall in Augusta before the Highways and Sewer Committee, said notice to be posted in two or more public places in the vicinity of the proposed street seven days before said meeting, said description being as follows:

Beginning at a point in the south line of the Thomaston Road, eighty (80) feet northwest of the northwest corner of Russell Winslow's land; thence South 39 degrees 42 minutes West 300 feet; thence North 60 degrees West, forty (40) feet, to a point; thence North 39 degrees 42 minutes East, three hundred (300) feet, to the southerly line of the Thomaston Road; thence South 60 degrees East, along the southerly line of the Thomaston Road, forty (40) feet, to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to describe a strip of land forty (40) feet, more or less, in width and three hundred (300) feet in length, extending southerly from the southerly line of the Thomaston Road. All as shown on a plan of a survey of lots belonging to Stanley E. Sproul, made in August 1948, by Waldo W. Hill, Civil Engineer. Name of Street: Porter Street

Know All Men by These Presents,

That I, Stanley E. Sproul of Augusta, in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine,

in consideration of one dollar and other valuable considerations,

paid by City of Augusta, a body corporate and politic, having its office in said Augusta,

the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said City of Augusta, its successors

and assigns forever, the following described street as a regular City Street, situated, in said Augusta, and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the south line of the Thomaston Road, eighty feet northwest of the northwest corner of Russell Winslow's land; thence South 39 degrees 42 minutes West, three hundred feet; thence North 60 degrees West, forty feet, to a point; thence North 39 degrees 42 minutes East, three hundred feet, to the southerly line of the Thomaston Road; thence South 60 degrees East, along the southerly line of the Thomaston Road, forty feet, to the point of beginning, for the purpose of a City Street.

Meaning and intending to describe a strip of land forty feet, more or less, in width and three hundred feet in length, extending southerly from the southerly line of the Thomaston Road. All as shown on a plan of a survey of lots belonging to the Grantor hereof, made in August 1948, by Waldo W. Hill, Civil Engineer.
