VOTED

At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta legally notified and warned and held by adjournment at the Town House in said Augusta on the 23rd, day of March 1846.

ARTICLE 29, To the Selectmen of Augusta.

Gentlemen:

You are respectfully requested to locate and layout a town road - commencing on Winthrop Street west of the land occupied by J.E. Ladd; thence running northerly to the south line of John Martin's land extended - keeping forty feet in width; thence easterly thirty feet in width to North Street, so-called - being in part the same street as is laid down in Perham's plan of said Town and called Prospect Street. Said road being much needed for the use of the Inhabitants of said Town. The subscriber guarantees that no damages shall be claimed from the owners of the land, if said road is located as now opened.

You are also requested to insert an article in the Warrant, calling the next town meeting, to see if the Town will accept the same.

VOTED

At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta legally notified and warned and held by adjournment at the Town House in said Augusta on the 23rd, day of March 1846.

ARTICLE 29, To the Selectmen of Augusta.

The Selectmen of Augusta have this day laid out the following roads upon the within petition, viz:

Beginning on the north side of Winthrop Street near the house of J. E. Ladd; thence running North 22 degrees East 54 rods to land of John Martin, this to be the easterly line of said road and to be forty feet in width.

And also starting in the easterly line of the above locations and running South 63 degrees East 22 rods to North Street and to be thirty feet in width.

All parties being notified by posting up two notices more than seven days prior to location.
