Gentlemen

The undersigned hereby request you to layout a road commencing at the east line of Bangor Street, nearly opposite the Coney Female Academy boarding house; thence running easterly as far Joseph F. Gannett, west line, thence northerly as far as A. B. Fellows' south line; thence westerly to Bangor Street; of such width as in your opinion will be necessary for the accommodation of the Inhabitants, thereon, and report your doings hereon to the Town at their next meeting for acceptance.

February 10th, 1849

In pursuance of the within petition we have this day laid out the road petitioned for, To wit: Commencing at a stone post in the east line of Bangor Street; thence South 65 degrees East, five hundred feet to a cedar post; thence North twenty-five degrees East, three hundred and ninety-four feet to a cedar post; thence North 65 degrees West four hundred and fourteen feet to the southwest corner of L. Farrington store on Bangor Street, the first five hundred feet lying north of said monument, and to be forty feet wide. Three hundred ninety-four feet

laying west, and four hundred and fourteen feet of said road laying south of said monument, and to be forty feet wide, all persons were legally notified and no damages are claimed.

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Augusta have been Petition by Josiah M. Potter and seven others to layout a street or road in said City:

Commencing at the east end of School Street as now established and running easterly two hundred feet and to the east line of land of said Josiah M. Potter to and terminating at the easterly line of said Potter's land and the said Council at a session thereof, on the twenty-eighth day of September ORDERED the City Clerk to give notice of the intention of said Council to layout said proposed street or road. All persons interested are hereby notified to appear before a Committee of said Council at the dwelling house of said Josiah M. Potter on the premises at nine o'clock a.m., on the seventeenth day of October 1861 when and where said Committee will proceed to layout the same.

The Committee on New Streets have this day laid out a street as prayed for by the Petition of Josiah M. Potter and others, upon which notice was ORDERED by the City Council at their last meeting as follows to wit:

Commencing at the eastern termination of School Street at the south west corner of Josiah M. Potter's land and from; thence running easterly on said Potter south line two hundred feet to the south east corner of said Potter's land said road to be forty feet wide and on the south side of said line, said road passes over land reserved for a street on each side of which the lots have all been conveyed bounded thereon, and no damages were claimed by any persons and none allowed by us due notice of the laying out of said street was given as required by the City Ordinances relative thereto, as will appear by the notice thereof of the City Clerk and return of the City Marshal thereon, herewith returned.

READ AND PASSED

The Committee on New Streets, to whom was referred the petition of Harvey Chisam and others for a new street, and upon which notice was ordered, have had the same under consideration and report: That the City Clerk gave notice to layout and said street as prayed for, from the eastern terminus of School Street to and terminating at the Belfast Road, near the house of H. W. Clark, which notice was posted on two public and conspicuous places in the

vicinity of said street, on the 6th day of July 1867, notifying all persons interested to appear before a Committee of said Council at the house of J. E. Ward at 2 o'clock p.m. of the 13th day of July 1867, at which time and place your Committee met, and after viewing the route, hearing the petitioners and considering the matter, laid out a public road or street as follows, viz:

Commencing at an ash tree at the eastern termination of School Street, and in the north line thereof, and thence running South 63 degrees East parallel with the side or lot lines, sixty-three rods to a stake in the northwesterly line of the new Belfast Road; the road to be on the southerly side of the said line and forty-two feet wide. On the 13th day of July 1867 your Committee filed with City Clerk of said City, the laying out of said street, with the bounds and admeasurements of said street as above reported, and we have estimated the damages of laying out said street as, follows, viz: No damage claimed and none allowed.

The report was accepted by both branches of the City Council August 5th, 1867.

The Committee on New Streets, to whom was referred the petition of Harvey Chisam and others for a new street, and upon which notice was ordered, have had the same under consideration, and report: That the City Clerk give notice to layout said street as prayed for, from the eastern terminus of School Street to and terminating at the Belfast Road, near the house of H. W. Clark, which notice was posted on two public and conspicuous places in the vicinity of said street, on the 6th day of July, 1867. Notifying all persons interested to appear before a Committee of said Council at the house of J. E. Morse at 2 o'clock p.m. of the 13th day of July, 1867, at which time and place your Committee met, and after viewing the route, hearing the petitioners and considering the matter, laid out a public road or street as follows, viz:

Commencing at an ash tree at the eastern termination of School Street, and in the north line thereof, and; thence running South 63 degrees East, parallel with the side or lot lines, sixty-three rods to a stake in the northwesterly line of the new Belfast Road; the road to be on the southerly side of the said line and forty-two feet wide.

On the 13th day of July 1867, your Committee filed with the City Clerk of said City the laying out of said street, with the bounds and admeasurements of said street as above reported, and we have estimated the damages of laying out said street as follows, viz: No damages claimed and none allowed.
